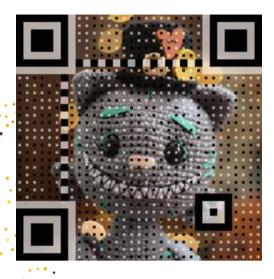
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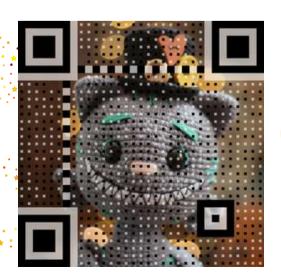

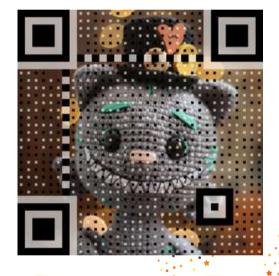
Eye-tightening video. Press the button or scan the code.

Important information



- In this pattern, I give recommendations on where to modify the beginning of the round. Pay attention! The look and evenness of your product depends on this.
- Your toy size may differ from mine. It depends on the materials, the hook, and the tension of your crocheting.
- I also recommend taking exactly the hook that is convenient for you, for this or that yarn. All materials presented in this pattern were used to create these particular toys and are of a recommendatory nature.
- The growth of the Cheshire is 23 cm. (using the indicated materials)
- All details are crochetted in a spiral, except where specified.
- Yarnart jeans (160m/50g), alize cotton gold (330m/100g), gazal jeans, alize cotton gold hobby yarns have almost the same footage and weight, so these models can be replaced with each other.

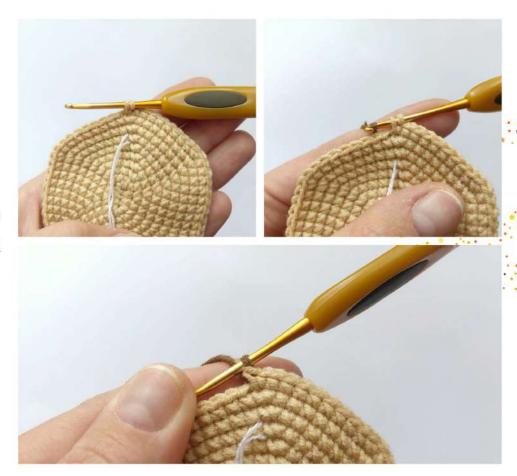

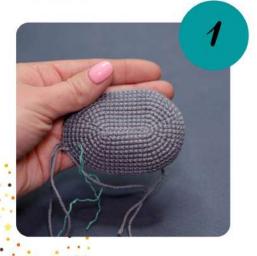

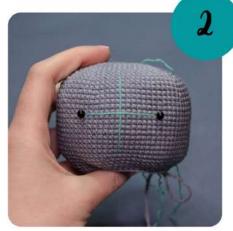














Stuff as you go.

Start to crochet in grey color. Make chain 12 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook:

1 rnd: 10 sc; 3 sc in last chain (do not turn your work, crochet on the other side of the chain): 9 sc; inc (24)

2 rnd: inc; 9 sc; 3 inc; 9 sc; 2 inc (30)

3 rnd: 1 sc; inc; 9 sc; (1 sc; inc)*3; 9 sc; (1 sc; inc)*2 (36)

4 rnd: inc; 2 sc; 9 sc; (inc; 2 sc)*3; 9 sc; (inc; 2 sc)*2 (42)

5 rnd: 3 sc; inc; 9 sc; (3 sc; inc)*3; 9 sc; (3 sc; inc)*2 (48)

6 rnd: inc; 4 sc; 9 sc; (inc; 4 sc)*3; 9 sc; (inc; 4 sc)*2 (54)

7 rnd: 5 sc; inc; 9 sc; (5 sc; inc)*3; 9 sc; (5 sc; inc)*2 (60)

8 rnd: inc; 6 sc; 9 sc; (inc; 6 sc)*3; 9 sc; (inc; 6 sc)*2 (66)

9-10 rnd (2 rounds): 66 sc

11 rnd: 7 sc; inc; 9 sc; (7 sc; inc)*3; 9 sc; (7 sc; inc)*2 (72)

12-24 rnd (13 rounds): 72 sc

Insert the eyes on the secure mount between the 15th and 16th rounds. The distance between the holes for the eyes 14 sc (*photo 2*), between the corners of the eyes 10-11 sc (*photo 3*).

25 rnd: (10 sc; dec)*6 (66)

26 rnd: (9 sc; dec)*6 (60)

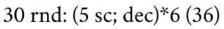
27 rnd; (8 sc; dec)*6 (54)

28 rnd: (7 sc; dec)*6 (48)

29 rnd: (6 sc; dec)*6 (42)



Head



31 rnd: (4 sc; dec)*6 (30)

32 rnd: (3 sc; dec)*6 (24)

33 rnd: (2 sc; dec)*6 (18)

34 rnd: (1 sc; dec)*6 (12)

35 rnd: 6 dec

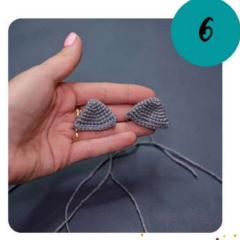
Cut the yarn and fasten off. Pull the opening closed.

Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.









Start to crochet in grey color, do not stuff.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 rnd: (1 sc; inc)*3 (9)

3 rnd: (2 sc; inc)*3 (12)

4 rnd: (3 sc; inc)*3 (15)

5 rnd: (4 sc; inc)*3 (18)

6 rnd: (5 sc; inc)*3 (21)

•7 rnd: (6 sc; inc)*3 (24)

8 rnd: 24 sc

Fold the piece in half and crochet 12 sc through both sides.

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.





Wool on the cheeks



Start to crochet in grey color.

(make chain 7 ch, crochet from the 3rd loop from the hook:

inc(dc); 4 hdc)*3 (repeat 3 times starting with make chain)

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.



Head decoration

- 1. We make an eye-tightening, as shown in the video (page 1).
- 2. Embroider the whites of the eyes with turquoise yarn (photo 9).





Next, we move on to the design of the muzzle. Please note that there are two options in the design of the nose and mouth.





Head decoration







Option 2

For the design of the cat's face, I tried 2 options, for which I will give descriptions. On my Cheshire, I left option number 2 (*photo 11*).

Option 1.

1. We mark the points for the nose.

Top points between 17th and 18th rounds.

Lower point in the center of the head between the 19th and 20th rounds (*photo 12*). How to embroider a neat triangular nose, you can watch the video (*page 1*).

2. Embroider nose with powder-colored yarn (photo 13).







Option 2.

We embroider the spout with powder-colored yarn between 17 and 18 rows with several stitches (*photo 14*).





Head decoration















3. We mark the points for the mouth (photo 15).

Points 1 and 2 between the 18th and 19th rounds, stepping back from the edges of the eyes 4 sc to the sides.

Point 3 between 21 and 22 rounds in the center.

- 4. We embroider the top line of a smile with thin black yarn, as shown in the video (page 1).
- 5. Cut out a smile from white felt. For design according to option No. 2, I made it a little thinner than option No. 1.
- 6. Glue the felt to the head (photo 16).
- 7. On the bottom line of the smile we embroider another line with thin black yarn. (photo 17).
- 8. We embroider teeth with thin black yarn. For option No. 1 straight lines (*photo 18-19*); for option number 2 zigzag (*photo 20*).

further processing has no differences.





Head decoration















- 9. Sew on the ears from the 4th to 10-11 rounds.
- 10. Sew the fur on the cheeks on the sides of the head from the 23rd to the 28th rounds.
- 11. With turquoise yarn we embroider eyebrows from the 10th to the 11th rounds, the width of the eyebrows is 6-7 sc (*photo 22*).
- 12. With turquoise yarn, we embroider strips on top of the head 3 pcs. different lengths (*photo 23*); bottom of the head 2 pcs. the same length (*photo 24*); on the sides of the head 3 pcs. different lengths (*photo 25*).
- 13. We embroider 1 stitch on all emerald stripes with a thin black thread (photo 26).
- 14. With black yarn we embroider "arrows" under the eyes (photo 26).





Legs









Start to crochet in grey color, stuff as you go only part of the foot.

Make chain 9 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook:

1 rnd: 7 sc; 3 sc in last chain (do not turn your work, crochet on the other side of

the chain): 6 sc; inc (18)

2 rnd: inc; 6 sc; 3 inc; 6 sc; 2 inc (24)

3 rnd: 1 sc; inc; 6 sc; (1 sc; inc)*3; 6 sc; (1 sc; inc)*2 (30)

4 rnd: 2 sc; inc; 6 sc; (2 sc; inc)*3; 6 sc; (2 sc; inc)*2 (36)

We cut the insole from plastic to the size of the resulting oval (photo 27).

5 rnd: BLO: 36 sc

6-9 rnd (4 rounds): 36 sc

Stitch marker move to the center of the heel.

10 rnd: 6 sc; (2 sc; dec)*6; 6 sc (30)

11 rnd: 6 sc; (dec; 1 sc)*6; 6 sc (24)

We insert the insole.

12 rnd: 3 sc; (1 sc; dec)*6; 3 sc (18)

13-14 rnd (2 rounds): 18 sc

Change to turquoise color:

15 rnd: 18 sc

Change to grey color:

16 rnd: (5 sc; inc)*3 (21)

17 rnd: 21 sc





Legs



Change to turquoise color:

18 rnd: 21 sc

Change to grey color:

19 rnd: 21 sc

20 rnd: (6 sc; inc)*3 (24)

Change to turquoise color:

21 rnd: 24 sc

Change to grey color:

22-23 rnd (2 rounds): 24 sc

Change to turquoise color:

24 rnd: 24 sc

Change to grey color:

25 rnd: 24 sc

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Crochet leg 2 the same way.



Body

Start to crochet in grey color.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)*6 (18)

4 rnd: (2 sc; inc)*6 (24)

5 rnd: (3 sc; inc)*6 (30)

6 rnd: (4 sc; inc)*6 (36)

7 rnd: (5 sc; inc)*6 (42)

8 rnd: (6 sc; inc)*6 (48)

9 rnd: (7 sc; inc)*6 (54)

10 rnd: (8 sc; inc)*6 (60)

11 rnd: (9 sc; inc)*6 (66)

Next, we will attach the legs in two steps. Carefully follow the photos and how the legs are located. The marker for the beginning of the row runs on our back.

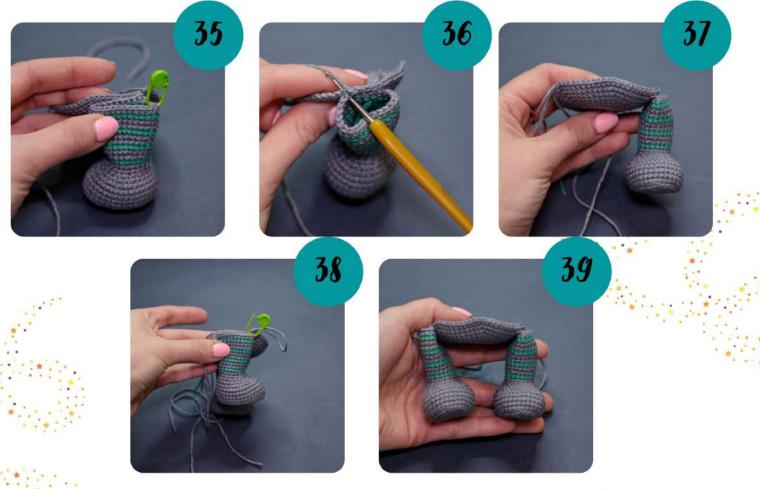








First, let's define the loops for the first stage of joining. To do this, fold the leg so that the addition line is parallel to the foot (*photo 32*), on the left leg, mark with a marker the most extreme loop on the back of the leg (*photo 33*), on the right leg, the extreme loop from the front of the leg (*photo 34*).



12 rnd: 11 sc on the body; 12 sc along with the loops of the left leg (with loops marked with a marker (*photo 35-36*)); 21 sc on the body; 12 sc along with the loops of the right leg (start with a loop checked with a marker (*photo 38*); 10 sc on the body (66) On *page 1* you can watch a video on how to attach the legs.

Body









13 rnd: 11 sc; 12 on the remaining loops of the leg (photo 40); 21 sc; 12 sc on the remaining loops of the leg; 10 sc (66)

14-22 rnd (9 rounds): 66 sc

We transfer the marker of the beginning of the row to the center of the back.

23 rnd: (1 sc; dec)*3; 48 sc; (1 sc; dec)*3 (60)

24 rnd: 60 sc

We take the wire, fold it as shown in photo 42, wrap the ends with electrical tape, insert it into the legs and body. Stuff as you go.

25 rnd: 18 sc; (2 sc; dec)*6; 18 sc (54)

26 rnd: 54 sc

Staff as body you go.

27 rnd: 18 sc; (dec; 1 sc)*6; 18 sc (48)

28-37 rnd (10 rounds): 48 sc

38 rnd: (14 sc; dec)*3 (45)

39 rnd: 45 sc

40 rnd: (13 sc; dec)*3 (42)

41 rnd: (5 sc; dec)*6 (36)

42 rnd: (4 sc; dec)*6 (30)

43 rnd: (3 sc; dec)*6 (24)

44-47 rnd (4 rounds): 24 sc



Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.





Tail









Start to crochet in grey color. Stuff as you go.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)*6 (18)

Change to turquoise color:

4 rnd: (2 sc; inc)*6 (24)

Change to gray color:

5 rnd: (3 sc; inc)*6 (30)

6-7 rnd (2 rounds): 30 sc

Change to turquoise color:

8-9 rnd (2 rounds): 30 sc

Change to gray color:

10-12 rnd (3 rounds): 30 sc

Change to turquoise color:

13 rnd: 30 sc

Change to gray color:

14-16 rnd (3 rounds): 30 sc

Change to turquoise color:

17-18 rnd (2 rounds): 30 sc

Change to gray color:

19 rnd: 4 sc; (5 sc; dec)*3; 5 sc (27)

20-21 rnd (2 rounds): 27 sc

Change to turquoise color:

22 rnd: 27 sc

Change to gray color:

23-24 rnd (2 rounds): 27 sc

25 rnd: 4 sc; (dec; 4 sc)*3; 5 sc (24)

Change to turquoise color:

26-27 rnd (2 rounds): 24 sc

Change to gray color:

28-30 rnd (3 rounds): 24 sc

Change to turquoise color:

31 rnd: 4 sc; (3 sc; dec)*3; 5 sc (21)

Change to gray color:

32-34 rnd (3 rounds): 21 sc

Change to turquoise color:

35 rnd: 4 sc; (dec; 2 sc)*3; 5 sc (18)

36 rnd: 18 sc

Change to gray color:

37-38 rnd (2 rounds): 18 sc

39 rnd: 4 sc; (1 sc; dec)*3; 5 sc (15)

Change to turquoise color:

40 rnd: 15 sc



Tail



Change to gray color:

41-42 rnd (2 rounds): 15 sc

43 rnd: 4 sc; 3 dec; 5 sc (12)

44-46 rnd (3 rounds): 12 sc

Fold the piece in half and crochet 6 sc through both sides. (photo 45-46).

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.

Arms







Start to crochet in gray color. Sruff as you go 2/3 part.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)*6 (18)

4-7 rnd (4 rounds): 18 sc

8 rnd: 8 sc; bobble st; 9 sc (18)

9-10 rnd (2 rounds): 18 sc

11 rnd: dec; 5 sc; 2 dec; 5 sc; dec (14)

12 rnd: 5 sc; 2 dec; 5 sc (12)

13-27 rnd (15 rounds): 12 sc

Fold the piece in half and crochet 6 sc through both sides (photo 48).

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.

With turquoise yarn, we embroider stripes with stitches on the sides of the arms

(photo 49).

Hat







Start to crochet in black color.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)*6 (18)

4 rnd: (2 sc; inc)*6 (24)

5 rnd: (3 sc; inc)*6 (30)

6 rnd: (4 sc; inc)*6 (36)

7 rnd: (5 sc; inc)*6 (42)

8 rnd: BLO: 42 sc

9 rnd: 42 sc

10 rnd: (12 sc; dec)*3 (39)

11-12 rnd (2 rounds): 39 sc

13 rnd: (11 sc; dec)*3 (36)

14-15 rnd (2 rounds): 36 sc

16 rnd: (10 sc; dec)*3 (33)

17 rnd: 33 sc

18 rnd: (9 sc; dec)*3 (30)

19 rnd: <u>FLO</u>: (4 sc; inc)*6 (36)

20 rnd: (5 sc; inc)*6 (42)

21 rnd: (6 sc; inc)*6 (48)

22 rnd: (7 sc; inc)*6 (54)

23 rnd: (8 sc; inc)*6 (60)

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.

Decorate the texture with buttons (photo 51).



Clock







55

Crocheting two identical parts. White and yellow.

Attention! Do not cut the thread on the yellow part!

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)*6 (18)

4 rnd: (2 sc; inc)*6 (24)

We fix and cut the thread on the white part, embroider

the clock hands with a thin black thread (photo 52).

5 rnd: On the yellow part we make chain 1, turn, we apply the white part to the yellow one (inside out to each other). Crocheting for both

parts 24 sc (photo 54).

6 rnd: 24 sl st

Watch the video on how to connect watch

parts (page 1).

Make chain 60 ch (photo 55), sl st in the last chain (photo 56).

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.







Assembly and decoration









- 1. We sew a hat to the head, in the process we fill it (photo 57).
- 2. Turquoise yarn we embroider strips on the sides of the body of different lengths (*photo 58-59*).
- 3. Sew the head to the body. In the process of sewing, we add filler to the neck for stability of the head.
- 4. Sew handles between 39 and 40 rounds.
- 5. Sew on the tail, shifting it a little obliquely from rounds 11 to 15 (*photo 60*).
