IRON MAN

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Hello! My name is Dasha and I'm a fan of amigurumi! I create and crochet brooches, toys and also make patterns to them. I've been keen on handmade since

my childhood, but only crocheting has been thrown me into! Recently, I've started to blog my cozy Instagram about crocheting.

Supplies

The size of the completed doll is 10.53 inches if you use the similar supplies mentioned below.

I) Yarn YarnArt Jeans (50g/160m, 55% cotton, 45% acryl):

- color 90 (red) - for outfit,

- color 84 (mustard) for outfit and mask,
- color 75 (blue) for outfit and mask.

You can use any other yarn of the same characteristics.

2) A hook, suitable for the chosen yarn; I've used Tulip 1.5; 3) Black moulinet thread; 4) Wire, 2 mm thick (2 pieces of about 12.48 inches long) and I/I.5 mm thick (of about 10.14 inches long) and adhesive tape. If you are going to make the doll without any skeleton, you should use a barbecue skewer or any other skeleton for the neck. 5) A piece of plastic or cardboard of 3.9 x 3.9 inches; 6) The pliers, scissors, pins; 7) A needle and a tapestry needle; 8) Fiberfill.



Abbreviations



MR - Magic Ring sc - single crochet ch - chain dec - decrease inc - increase hdc - half double crochet dc - double crochet sl st - slip stitch BLO - Back loop only FLO - Front loop only (..)* - repeat instructions in brackets with the required number of times

Process description Arms





3-dc-bobble



Red color; 2 pieces Don't fill with fiber. **I row:** 6 sc in MR 2 row: 6 inc (12) 3 row: 12 sc 4 row: right arm: I (3dc bobble) - II sc (12) left arm: 6 sc - I (3 dc bobble) - 5 sc (I2)5 row: I dec - 4 sc - I dec - 4 sc (IO) (the Ist dec along right arm and the 2nd dec along left arm must be exactly above 3 dc bobble) 6-11 row (6 rows): 10 sc **12 row:** I sc - I inc - 4 sc - I inc - 3 sc (12)Inc are exactly at the sides of the arm. If it's necessary work required number of shifting sc. 13-17 row (5 rows): 12 sc **18 row:** 3 sc - 1 inc - 5 sc - 1 inc - 2 sc (14)Inc are exactly at the sides of the arm. If it's necessary work required number of shifting sc. Change thread color into mustard one, don't cut red thread. **19 row:** 14 sl st (work loose enough) **20 row:** 14 sc (BLO and sc of the 18th row) (point "1" in the photo) 21-25 row (5 rows): 14 sc Change thread color into red one, cut mustard thread. **26 row:** 14 sl st (work loose enough) 27 row: 14 sc (BLO and sc of the 25th row)



28 - 30 row (3 rows): 14 sc

If it's necessary work shifting sc (in my case, I've worked 2 shifting sc) to finish the work along an inner part of the arm. Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.


Palm overlay

Blue color; 2 pieces **1 row:** 8 sc in MR Fix and cut thread, leave a long tail thread for attaching.

Attach the overlays as in the photo.

Legs

Red color. 2 pieces. Don't fill with fiber. 10 ch, turn the work, from the 2nd ch. 1 row: 8 sc - 3 sc in 1 ch - 7 sc - 1 inc (20) 2 row: 1 inc - 7 sc - 3 inc - 7 sc - 2 inc (26) 3 row: 1 sc - 1 inc - 7 sc - (1 sc - 1 inc)*3 - 7 sc - (1 sc -1 inc)*2 (32) Link to the video on how to make an oval. Press the icon to the link.



OVAL

TRIPLE DECREASE

Insert an insole.

Cut an oval insole from cardboard or plastic along the length of your insole (in my case, the oval is 0,78 x 1,36 inches).

Insert (you can glue it) inside the foot. I recommend you to cut the 2nd insole at once to have both sides of the same size.

Dec from 6 to 8 row must be exactly along the center of the toe of leg; if it's necessary work required number of shifting sc.

6 row: 10 sc - 6 dec - 10 sc (26) 7 row: 10 sc - 3 dec - 10 sc (23)

8 row: 10 sc - 1 triple dec- 10 sc (21)

Insert wire skeleton.

Take a piece of wire of 2mm thick and 12,48 inches long, bend it in spiral and wrap the part with adhesive tape, make a form of foot.

Insert wire skeleton inside the leg with wrapped end down. Then fill the foot with fiber tightly with the help of a skewer or sushi stick.

Fill the leg with fiber in the process.

WIRE SKELETON



9 row: (5 sc - 1 dec)*3 (18)

10 row: 4 sc - 1 dec - 8 sc - 1 dec - 2 sc (16) (dec are exactly at the sides of the leg)

II - 17 row (7 rows): 16 sc

18 row: $(3 \text{ sc} - 1 \text{ inc})^* 4 (20)$

19 - 29 row (11 rows): 20 sc

Work 2 shifting sc to have the marker exactly along the center of the back above the heel; place the marker.

Change thread color into mustard one, cut red thread.

30 row: 20 sl st (work loose enough)

3I row: 20 sc (BLO and sc of the 29th row)

32 - 38 row (7 rows): 20 sc

Work 2 shifting sc to have the marker exactly along the center of the back above the heel; place the marker.

Change thread color into red one, cut mustard thread.


39 row: 20 sl st (work loose enough)

40 row: 20 sc (BLO and sc of the 38th row) **41 row:** 20 sc









Don't work 5 sc along left leg. The marker must be exactly along the center of inner part of the leg. Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread. Work 5 shifting sc along right leg. The marker must be exactly along the center of inner part of the leg. Don't cut thread, we'll go on working.

Bind off the sole

Attach red thread to FLO of the 3rd row (point "2" in the photo) and work 32 sl st. Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.

Round front overlays

Red color, 2 pieces. **I row:** 6 sc in MR **2 row:** 6 inc Fix and cut thread, leave a long tail thread for attaching.

Oval front overlays

red color, 2 pieces. 5 ch, turn the work, from the 2nd ch I row: 3 sc - 3 sc in I ch - 2 sc - I inc (IO) 2 row: I inc - 2 sc - 3 inc - 2 sc - 2 inc (I6) Fix and cut thread, leave a long tail thread for attaching. Attach overlays as it's shown in the photo.

Body



Fill the body with fiber in the process.

Place the legs to have the toes facing straight. Leg attachment must be exactly along the center of inner part of hips. 3 ch, sl st in the sc of the first leg.

Twist wire of both legs to join them together as shown in the photo. Wrap twisted wire with adhesive tape to make wire skeleton safer.

42 row: 20 sc along one leg - 3 sc along the chain - 20 sc along the 2nd leg - 3 sc along the chain (46) Place the marker; it must be exactly in the back. **43 row:** 20 sc - 3 inc - 20 sc - 3 inc (52) **44 row:** 22 sc - 1 inc - 25 sc - 1 inc - 3 sc (54) **45 - 50 row** (6 rows): 54 sc **51 row:** (7 sc - 1 dec)*6 (48) **52 - 63 row** (12 rows): 48 sc **64 row:** 3 sc - 1 dec - (6 sc - 1 dec)*5 - 3 sc (42) **65 row:** 42 sc

Attach the arms.

Work 8 shifting sc to have the marker exactly at the side of the body before left arm attachment place.



Attach the arms in 4 stitches.

Attach the arms to the body to make the fingers facing straight. 66 row: 4 sc together with the arm (catch only inner part of the arm and the body together) - 17 sc along the body - 4 sc together with the arm (catch only inner part of the arm and the body together) - 17 sc along the body (42)

Insert wire inside the arms.

Take a piece of wire of 1/1,5mm thick and 10,14 inches long, bend it in both ends in 0,39 inches and wrap with adhesive plaster. Insert wire in both arms behind main skeleton (see the photo). Fill the arms with fiber with the help of a skewer or sushi stick (fill the palm tightly and the rest of arm a bit).

67 row: 10 sc along left arm - 17 sc along the body - 10 sc along right arm - 17 sc along the body (54) 68 row: (7 sc - 1 dec)*6 (48) 69 row: 3 sc - 1 dec - (6 sc -1 dec)*5 - 3 sc (42) 70 row: (5 sc - 1 dec)*6 (36) 71 row: 2 sc - 1 dec - (4 sc - 1 dec)*5 - 2 sc (30) 72 row: (3 sc - 1 dec)*6 (24) 73 row: 1 sc - 1 dec - (2 sc - 1 dec)*5 - 2 sc (18) 74 row: (1 sc - 1 dec)*6 (12) 75 - 82 row (8 rows): 12 sc 83 row: 6 dec Cut extra wire, fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.



Shoulder overlays

Red color, 2 pieces. **I row:** 6 sc in MR **2 row:** 6 inc Fix and cut thread, leave a long tail thread for attaching.

Central overlay

Blue color. **I row:** 8 sc in MR **2 row:** 8 inc (16) **3 row:** (1 sc -1 inc)*8 Fix and cut thread, leave a long tail thread for attaching.




Side overlays

Red color, 2 pieces. 15 ch, turn the work, from the 2nd ch. 1 row: 13 sc - 3 sc in 1 ch - 12sc - 1 inc (30) 2 row: 1 inc - 12sc - 3 inc - 12 sc - 2 inc (36) Fix and cut thread, leave a long tail thread for attaching.

Attach overlays as it's shown in the photo.

Head

See the photos on the next page. Red color. Fill the head with fiber in the process: stuff the top of the head firmly and fill some fiber closer to the neck area. 13 ch, turn the work, from the 2nd ch. I **row**: II sc - 3 sc in I stitch-IO sc - I inc (26) 2 row: 1 inc - 10 sc - 3 inc - 10 sc - 2 inc (32) 3 row: 1 sc - 1 inc - 10 sc - (1 sc - 1 inc)*3 - 10 sc - (1 sc - 1 inc)*2 (38) 4 row: 2 sc - 1 inc - 10 sc - (2 sc - 1 inc)*3 - 10 sc - (2 sc - 1 inc)*2 (44) 5 row: 3 sc - 1 inc - 10 sc - (3 sc - 1 inc)*3 - 10 sc - (3 sc - 1 inc)*2 (50) 6 **row:** 4sc - 1 inc - 10 sc - (4 sc - 1 inc)*3 - 10 sc - (4 sc - 1 inc)*2 (56) 7 row: 25 sc - 1 inc - 27 sc - 1 inc - 2 sc (58) Inc must be exactly at the sides. 8 row: 58 sc **9 row:** 26 sc - 1 inc - 28 sc - 1 inc - 2 sc (60) Dec must be exactly at the sides. 10-20 row (11 rows): 60 sc **2I row:** $4 \operatorname{sc} - 1 \operatorname{dec} - (8 \operatorname{sc} - 1 \operatorname{dec})^* 5 - 4 \operatorname{sc} (54)$ **22 row:** (7 sc - 1 dec)*6 (48) **23 row:** $\frac{1}{3}$ sc - I dec - $(6 \text{ sc} - I \text{ dec})^* 5 - 3 \text{ sc} (42)$ **24 row:** (5 sc- 1 dec)*6 (36) **25 row:** $2 \text{ sc} - 1 \text{ dec} - (4 \text{ sc} - 1 \text{ dec})^* 5 - 2 \text{ sc} (30)$ **26 row:** $(3 \text{ sc} - 1 \text{ dec})^{*} 6 (24)$ **27 row:** I sc - I dec - $(2 \text{ sc} - I \text{ dec})^* 5 - I \text{ sc} (18)$ **28 row:** $(4 \text{ sc} - 1 \text{ dec})^*$ (15) 29 row: BLO 15 sc 30-36 row (7 rows): 15 sc Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread. Fill the head with fiber.



Push the lower part of the neck inside the head with the help of sushi stick. Make sure the head is filled with fiber tightly and it can be easily inserted onto the neck. Try the head on the body.

Firstly make the mask and then fix it to the body.

Mask



Mustard color. 15 ch, turn the work, from the 2nd ch (in turning rows). I row: 14 sc, 1 ch, turn the work 2 row: 1 inc - 12 sc - 1 inc, 1 ch, turn the work (16) **3 row:** 16 sc. 1 ch. turn the work 4 row: 1 inc - 14 ch - 1 inc, 1 ch, turn the work (18) **5 row:** 18sc. 1 ch, turn the work **6 row:** I inc - 16sc - I inc, I ch, turn the work (20) 7 row: 20 sc, 1 ch, turn the work Work the eyes, using jacquard technique (don't cut unworking thread, but work it together with the working one), there are the following abbreviations in 8-9 rows for your convenience: "m" mustard thread color, "b" - blue thread color. 8 - 9 row (2 rows): m.3 sc - b.5 sc - m.4 sc - b.5 sc - b.3 sc, 1 ch, turn the work (20) Cut blue thread. 10 - 11 row(2 rows): 20 sc, 1 ch, turn the work Next rows the central part is worked. 12 row: 8 sc, I ch, turn the work **13 row:** I dec - 4 sc - I dec, I ch, turn the work (6) **14 row:** 6 sc, I ch, turn the work 15 row: Idec - 2 sc - I dec, I ch, turn the work 16 row: 4 sc Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.

Attach mustard thread color to the last sc of the 11th row (point "3" in the photo) and work the 2nd part as the central one. Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.



Attach mustard thread color to the last sc of the 1st row (point "4", depicted with an arrow in the photo) and work round in sc.

Embroider the eye edges with black moulinet thread (in 1 thread) and a straight mouth line bwtween 1 and 2 rows, 3 sc wide.

Attach the mask to the face with mustard thread (in I thread).



<u>Head attachment</u> Attach the head to the body.
