CROCHET GUIDE FOR AMIGURUMI 2D "COW LOLÓ"

"Just let me eat

You are ready to start knitting your cow Lolo in Amigurumi 2D?

Materials:

- Cotton combed threads 8/3 little quantity (approx. 10gr) in 3 colors: for the body: natural, brown and salmón. Also green for the
 grass. Mustard for the horns. These last two colors in very few quantities too
- Security eyes or two small black beads
- Dmc embroidery thread one strand or sewing thread in black and white
- Crochet hook Nro. 1,5mm
- Darning needle
- Sewing needle
- Scissors
- Soft stuffing or polyfiber fill
- Keychain to attach to the finished plushie



Note: The materials listed before are the ones I use for my designs. Please feel free to use the materials you feel more comfortable with. Remember to use the correct hook for the thread and yarn that you choose. The outcome may vary in size and texture depending of your materials and the tension that you use, besides the tension in each crocheters is unique.

Abbreviations: (U.S. Terminology)

st = Stitch
ch = Chain
slst= Slip Stitch
sc= Single crochet
inc= Increase
dec= Decrease

▲ = Beginning



In this knitting guide you will find the step by step with photos to knit your own Amigurumi 2D Cow Loló. You can give it the purpose you want the most, use the yarn you want. You dare?

Let's find a

Quiet place in the house to enjoy knitting, do you think?



In color salmón, natural and brown

We will start by weaving the head, the body, the udders, the legs and the ears. Then the body assembly.

In this fabric, in addition to knitting Amigurumi 2D we will also weave with the Jacquard technique. Do not worry! Here I leave you my tips and my guide for you to achieve it.

Please read the guide very carefully.

IMPORTANT

All rounds weave in a spiral and dot marker is used. It is recommended to read and observe the chart carefully before starting to knit.

Jacquard Tip:

It's Recommended → Every time a new line of color is added and the previous round is woven in a different color, backloops are woven in this way, it will be neater and more beautiful to my liking. (Photo)

We start by weaving in salmon colored yarn, then we incorporate natural and brown and we can cut the pink strand. See charts →

s = Salmón n = natural y b = brown

We started in salmón color!

- 1. Ch 10
- Crochet around the chain in the following order, skip the first ch: Sc inc, 7sc, 4sc in the next ch, 7sc, Sc inc (22 st)
- 3. Sc inc, 9sc, Sc inc, Sc inc, 9sc, Sc inc. (26 st)
- 4. 26sc
- 5. Sc inc, 11sc, Sc inc, Sc inc, 11sc, Sc inc. (30 st)
- 6. A 9.30sc

Ahora incorporamos el color natural y a partir de la próxima vuelta podemos cortar la hebra del color salmón.

- 10. 30sc (1s, 13n, 16s) (30 st)
- 11. 30sc (2n, 5b, 23n). (30 st)
- 12. Sc dec (b), 11 sc (6b, 5n), Sc dec (n), Sc dec (n), 11sc (n), Sc dec (n). (26 st)




Chart Reading:

Graphic reading in Amigurumi 2D, it starts where the black triangle marks and each row is read from right to left. Then you continue to knit in the same direction, but the reading of the graph turns left to right. In the case of being left-handed, it is read in reverse. Eg Row 3: knit inc, 11sc, 2 inc (because we turn the reading from left to right), 11sc, inc. End of return.



- 13. 26sc (8b, 18n). (26 st)
- 14. 26sc (8b, 18n). (26 st)
- 15. Sc dec (b), 9sc (5b, 4n), Sc dec (n), Se dec (n), 9sc (n), Sc dec (n). (22 st)
- 16. Sc dec (b), 7sc (3b, 4n), Sc dec (n), Sc dec (n), 7sc (n), Sc dec (n). (18 st)

Cut the excess row to close the fabric after filling.

Sew taking the thread from behind



Eary

Knit two (2)


In natural colors

- 1. Ch 5
- Crochet around the chain in the following order, skip the first ch: Sc inc, 2sc, 4sc in the next ch, 2sc, Sc inc (12 st)
- **3**. 12sc
- 4. 12sc
- 5. Sc dec, 2sc, Sc dec, Sc dec, 2sc, Sc dec (8 st)

Cut the thread long enough to later sew to the head and not fill

We continue with the Corps, do you think?

Here we will weave with color changes. We start with the natural color and then we incorporate the brown.

n = natural y b = brown


- 1. Ch 14 (n)
- 2. Crochet around the chain in the following order, skip the first ch: Sc inc, 11sc, 4sc in the next ch, 11sc, Sc inc (30 st) in (n)

From now on we incorporate the color (b)

- 3. Sc inc (n), 13sc (5n, 8b), Sc inc (b), Sc inc (b), 13sc (8b, 5n), Sc inc (n). (34 st)
- 4. Sc inc (n), 15sc (6n, 9b), Sc inc (b), Sc inc (b), 15sc (9b, 6n), Sc inc (n). (38 st)
- 5. Sc inc (n), 17sc (8n, 9b), Sc inc (b), Sc inc (b), 17sc (9b, 8n), Sc inc (n). (42 st)
- 6. 42sc (11n, 20b, 11n). (42 st)
- 7. Sc inc(n), 19sc (11n, 7b, 1n), Sc inc (n), Sc inc (n), 19sc (1n, 7b, 11n), Sc inc (n). (46 st)
- 8. 46sc (3b, 11n, 5b, 8n, 5b, 11n, 3b). (46 st)
- 9. 46sc (4b, 38n, 4b). (46 st)
- 10. 46sc (5b, 36n, 5b). (46 st)
- 11. 46sc (6b, 34n, 6b). (46 st)
- 12. 46sc (6b, 9n, 4b, 8n, 4b, 9n, 6b). (46 st)
- 13. 46sc (6b, 8n, 5b, 8n, 5b, 8n, 6b). (46 st)
- 14. 46sc (6b, 8n, 5b, 8n, 5b, 8n, 6b). (46 st)
- 15. 46sc (6b, 7n, 6b, 8n, 6b, 7n, 6b). (46 st)
- 16. 46sc (5b, 7n, 7b, 8n, 7b, 7n, 5b). (46 st)
- 17. Sc dec (b), 19sc (2b, 7n, 8b, 2n), Sc dec (n), Sc dec (n), 19sc (2n, 8b, 7n, 2b), Sc dec (b). (42 st)
- 18. 42sc (2b, 8n, 7b, 8n, 7b, 8n, 2b). (42 st)
- 19. Sc inc (n), 17sc (9n, 5b, 3n), Sc dec (n), Sc dec (n), 17sc (3n, 5b, 9n), Sc dec (n). (38 st)
- 20. Sc dec (n), 15sc (n), Sc dec (n), Sc dec (n), 15sc (n), Sc dec (n). (34 st)
- 21. Sc dec (n), 13sc (n), Sc dec (n), Sc dec (n), 13sc (n), Sc dec (n). (30 st)

We cut long strand to sew Backloops and fill with fleece


We must also weave its legs

Knit four (4)

In natural colors

- 1. Ch 3
- 2. Crochet around the chain in the following order, skip the first ch: Sc inc, 4sc in the next ch, Sc inc. (8 st)
- 3. A 5. 8sc

We cut long strand to sew Backloops and fill with fleece



And now comes a very fun part... The Assembly of our Cow Lolo

Let's start with the head!!!

Ears

 We sew the ears on the sides. The back part more diagonally leaving an exposed strand since later when we knit the fur, we will weave over this strand.





The horns

- We mark with pins if we need to. Place the side of the cow's ears
- In mustard color we thread the needle
- We make 3 loops which we then wrap with the same yarn









We continue with the eyes and the nose. Well you need them! • The eyes are beads. For this you received an extra instructions. Additional resource V.
They are placed between rounds 12 and 13.



 And the nose is made by my embroidery technique between rounds 7 and 8 with brown yarn. An additional resource is attached in this regard.



• Now we embroider it. First we mark it with brown bows.



Awww! She is so pretty!



Now for the finer details.

This part is my favorite!!! and to you?

Sew the legs (back)

• We sew the two legs in the lower part of the body



We sew the head to the body

• Sew between rounds 15 and 21.





Sew the legs (Front)

• The right arm is sewn between the rounds 13 and 1 pointing the hoof down



• And we sew the left arm between rounds 11 and 13, pointing the hoof towards its chin.



And let's not forget the cow's udders!!!

Knit one (1).

In Salmon colors

- 1. Ch 8
- 2. Crochet around the chain in the following order, skip the first ch: Sc inc, 5sc, 4sc in the next ch, 5sc, Sc inc. (18 st)
- 3. Sc inc, 7sc, Sc inc, Sc inc, 7sc, Sc inc. (22 st)
- 4. 22sc
- 5. 22sc

We cut long strand to sew Backloops and fill with fleece



• Sew the udders between rounds 4 and 7.



 Fill just before finishing closing the fabric. If we need we can help ourselves with a tweezers



 And we embroider the udders. Like the nose, we make two loops and wrap them with the same yarn



And to finish 3 more details! Come on, there is little work left!

The grass that Lolo likes to eat!

- For the grass, we will make 3 roundtrip tips that enter through the front of the mouth, and exit through the side.
- They enter and leave the same place but are inserted with stitches in the body of Vaca Lolo at different points, giving the illusion of grass
- We use green yarn. We thread it on the needle.
- And I leave you here the photo where I marked with the pins the entrance and the exit of the grass







• And as seen in the photo we are wrapping those stitches that simulate grass, each one, with loops.





Already in the final stretch! To show that it is eating, we fasten the hooves to the grass with stitches with brown yarn





What Happiness!

We have knitted a beautiful Loló Cow! ... for now the first

Your first 2D Amigurumi Cow. You can use them however you want. Deco toys or accessories. Use fine or thick thread. The limit is your imagination
