MATERIALS

- Crochet hook size 2.20 mm, 1.25mm and 1,5mm
- Yarn: Ricorumi, 100% cotton, 25g/57,5m:

∘01 - white∘06 - yellow∘31 - blue sky∘32 - blue

∘11 - pink
∘21 - salmon
∘23 - nude
∘44 - grass green
∘47 - pistachio
∘53 - caramel

26 - tangerine28 - red62 - pastel yellow63 - saffron

• Black glass or safety eyes Ø6 mm

- Black sewing thread for embroidery
- Tapestry needle
- Stuffing material
- Scissors
- Stitch markers or a thread to mark your rounds

The pattern is written in **English using US crochet** terminology. If you are familiar with the basic crochet techniques you should be able to follow the pattern easily.

Mario, Luigi, Peach and Daisy are approximately 10 and 12 cm from head to bottom. It may vary depending on the kind of yarn and hook size you use as well as your yarn tension.

TIPS AND INFORMATION

- Be sure to crochet all your amigurumi toys with **tight stitches** to prevent small gaps between your stitches when you stuff it. To prevent gaps between your stitches consider using a smaller size hook than what your yarn recommends.
- There are two major ways to crochet amigurumis: using the **V-shaped** single crochet stitch and the **X-shaped** single crochet stitch. In this pattern, I crochet my amigurumi using the **X-shaped** single crochet stitch. When you first take your yarn through your previous stitch, instead of wrapping your yarn over your crochet hook you wrap it **UNDER** your crochet hook. In other words, you "yarn under". It is this step that form the X-shaped single crochet stitch.
- Unless said otherwise in the pattern, all details are crocheted in **a spiral** without a slip stitch and lifting loops at the start of each round. To keep track of the **first stitch of your round** you can mark it using a stitch marker, a safety pin or a thread
- After crocheting your next round, you should end right **before** where you left your stitch marker which mark the beginning of your previous round.
- Stuff your amigurumi as you go. It will become difficult to stuff them when you're almost done and only have a round of 6 stitches. Don't be afraid to stuff your amigurumi fully, unless stated otherwise.
- When changing colours, always change your yarn at the last step of the last stitch of your previous colour (that is to say when you've yarn under once and you have two loops on your crochet hook -for single crochet-, take the new yarn to pull through both loops).



When working with a chain

There are different ways to work with a chain.

You can either work on the front loop or the back bump.

Depending on what you want to achieve, you might prefer to use each methods. Assume working with flo on chains, unless specified otherwise.

For example, if I want the hair string to look straighter, I would work with the back bump. On the contrary, if I want a more curly look, I'll prefer the front loop of the chain, as it will more naturally curl.

As for any other pieces such as the mustache, the crown, I'll crochet in the back bump mostly for aesthetic purposes: you'll less see a gap working in the flo.










The semi-change colour method

You might not use this method often, but it may come in handy when you'll work on the flo of a round with a different colour than the one you use to do the previous round. On the last round before your semi-change, do your final yarn over with the new colour (picture 5).

When you insert your hook through your stitch, yarn under with the A yarn (picture 6), the yarn of your previous round. For the final yarn over, use the B yarn (picture 7), the yarn of your future round. As you do this, twist your yarn (picture 8 to 10), so that each strand of yarn is knotted and keep more or less the shape of a normal stitch.



Changing colour

To change colour, you'll always do it on the last sc of the previous colour *(picture 13)*. For example:

Rnd 1: 4sc, change to pink, 4sc

After your first 3sc, you'll only do a YU with your A-Colour and then do the next YO with your B-Colour (picture 14).









The invisible finish

For some pieces, you'll use this technique.

To do this: once you have done your last stitch from your last round, make a slst in next stitch. Skip a stitch and insert your needle in the next stitch (picture 17). Then, insert your needle back in the blo of your slst as well as in the sc where you did your slst (so from the rnd before) (picture 18). Secure yarn and cut.







The picot stitch

This stitch is used when we want to add a little tip, usually between two dc or tr, etc.

After your last st. make a ch, then insert your hook in the two loops formed by the last st. and slst, then follow the instructions for the next stitches.

A ch-picot means you only make one ch before inserting your hook in the two loops formed by the previous stitch.

Here, the highlighted loops are the ones formed by the tr.















Head - Mario, Peach & Daisy

OUsing beige yarn

Rnd 1: MR 6 [6]

Rnd 2: 6 inc [12]

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) * 6 [18]

Rnd 4: sc, inc, (2sc, inc) * 5, sc [24]

Rnd 5: blo - (2sc, inc) * 8 [32]

Rnd 6: (3sc, inc) * 8 [40]

Rnd 7: 2sc, inc, (4sc, inc) * 7, 2sc [48]

Rnd 8: sc around [48]

Rnd 9: 18sc, dec, sc, dec, 2sc, dec, sc, dec,

18sc [44]

Rnd 10-16: sc around [44] - 7 rounds

Attach your eyes between rnd 11 & 12 between the 19-20 stitches and 25-26 stitches with a 6 stitches gap (picture 1-2)

Rnd 17: 16sc, dec, 8sc, dec, 16 sc [42]

Rnd 18: (5sc, dec) * 6 [36]

Start stuffing and continue as you go.

Rnd 19: 2sc, dec, (4sc, dec) *5, 2sc [30]

Rnd 20: (3sc, dec) * 6 [24]

Rnd 21: 1sc, dec, (2sc, dec) * 5, 1sc [18]

Rnd 22: (1sc, dec) * 6 [12]

Finish stuffing.

Rnd 23: 6dec [6]

Fasten off, leave a tail to weave in.

With your needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of the remaining stitches (picture 3-4) and pull it tight to close the head. Weave in the yarn end (picture 5).











Insert your needle through each front loops of rnd 23

Pull it tight to close the end and weave in the yarn end.









Peach -

Body

Holding your head **upside down**, connect **pink** yarn to the last remaining **flo** of **rnd 4**, then insert your hook in first **flo** of **rnd 4** to make your first sc of **rnd 1** (picture 1-2).

Rnd 1: flo - (5sc, inc) * 4 [28]

Rnd 2-6: sc around [28] - 5 rnds

Rnd 7: (5sc, dec) * 4 [24]

Rnd 8: flo - (sc, inc) * 12 [36] (picture 3)

Rnd 9: (5sc, inc) * 6 [42]

Start stuffing and continue as you go.

Rnd 10-18: sc around [42] - 9 rnds

Rnd 19: blo - (5sc, dec) * 6 [36]

Rnd 20: 2sc, dec, (4sc, dec) * 5, 2sc [30]

Rnd 21: (3sc, dec) * 6 [24]

Finish stuffing.

When you're almost finish with the doll be careful **not to stuff too much** or the bottom will bulge and your Peach won't be able to stand right.

Rnd 22: (sc, dec) * 8 [16]

Rnd 23: 8dec [8]

Fasten off, leave a tail to weave in.

With your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of the remaining stitches (picture 4) and pull it tight to close the body. Weave in the yarn end (picture 5).

Holding the body **upside down**, connect **pink** to the last remaining **flo** of **rnd 18**, (picture 6 to 8):

Using pink:

Rnd 1: flo - slst around [48]

Rnd 2: blo - sc around. [48]

Cut and fasten off the invisible way (picture 8-9).



Insert your hook in the last flo of round 5.



Pull up a loop and insert your hook in first flo: start your rnd..



Rnd 7: work in the flo.



Insert your needle in each flo. Pull it tight to close.



Insert your hook in last flo rnd 18. Rnd 2: blo - slst ground.



Fasten off the invisible way. See beginning of pdf for more.



Ruffles

While holding the **head down**:

Using **Salmon**:

Rnd 1: surface slst around on rnd 18, just below the remaining flo of the dress (picture 10 to 13) When you have 2 slst left to make: skip the first one and only surface slst in the last remaining stitch (picture 14-15) [42]

Then, make a new surface slst that touches the first one (picture 15)

Rnd 2: flo - (slst, hdc, inc-dc, hdc,) * 10. Skip the last stitch and slst in both loops of next slst. (picture 17) [51]

Fasten off and cut yarn (picture 18).



Insert your hook behind the first st. rnd 18.



Pull up a loop.



Insert your hook behind the second stitch. Pull up a loop and make your slst.



Skip one stitch and slst in the last one.



Make an additional slst behind the first one.



This is what it should look like.



Skip the next slst.



Slst in both loops of the last slst.



Insert your needle in next stitch, then back in the slst.



Panniers

Continue holding Peach her head down:

Using **Salmon**:

Start your surface slst around the **middle of the dress on the front** (picture 19-20) (for me it is between the **st. 13 & 14**, count them **rnd 7** before the **rnd** of dec.). Check (picture 21 to 23) to see how the back is made: we need to go "down" a rnd, as we work in spiral.

Rnd 1: surface slst around between rnd 7 & 8 (picture 19-20) [25] do one more slst (picture 24 to 26).

Rnd 2: flo - slst, inc-sc, inc-hdc, (inc-dc) * 2, tr, inc-tr, tr, (inc-dc) * 2, inc-hdc, inc-sc, slst, inc-sc, inc-hdc, (inc-dc) *2, tr, inc-tr, tr, (inc-dc) * 2, inc-hdc, inc-sc, slst.

Rnd 3: slst in first slst, **blo** - 20slst, next slst don't do it on the 2 loops but just below the two loops, **blo** - 21slst [43]. **Do one more slst**.

Fasten off and cut yarn (picture 27).



Insert your hook behind the first stitch of rnd 7. (the pin is on the 13rd stitch.)



Pull up a loop.



We are at the back of Peach, where we need to go "down" a rnd.



You'll have to go down to follow rnd 7.



This is what it should look like.



You now have done 24 surface slst.



Do one more, that touches the first one.



This is what it should look like.



Insert your needle at the base of your sist to create a little gap between the two parts.

Hair cap

Using pastel yellow:

Rnd 1: MR 6 [6]

Rnd 2: 6 inc [12]

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) * 6 [18]

Rnd 4: sc, inc, (2sc, inc) * 5, sc [24]

Rnd 5: (3sc, inc) * 6 [30]

Rnd 6: 2sc, inc (4sc, inc)*5, 2sc [36]

Rnd 7: (5sc, inc) * 6 [42]

Rnd 8: (13sc, inc) * 3 [45]

Rnd 9: sc around [45]

Rnd 10: 7sc, inc, (14sc, inc) * 2, 7sc [48]

Rnd 11-14: sc around [48] - 4 rounds

Rnd 15: 20sc, 11 slst, 17sc [48]

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

Mark the 19th stitch (picture 28).



Mark the 19th stitch. It should be one sc before the 11 slst.



We will work the strands of hair on the other side of the cap.



Turn the cap so the "wrong" side is outside.



Hair strands.

Return the hair cap so that the "right" side is now inside (picture 29-30). Insert your hook into the marked stitch, and start your chain (picture 31-32). For the chain here, always start from second chain from hook:

Ousing pastel yellow:

- 🔼 ch8 flo of chain slst, 6sc, slst in next stitch of the hair cap. (picture 33-34)
- **B** ch8 flo of chain 7sc, slst in next stitch of the hair cap.
- *ch14 back bump of chain sc, 12hdc, dec on the hair cap. Repeat from * 15 more times. For the dec, do a "normal decrease" not an invisible one (picture 35 to 39).
- ch8 flo of chain 7sc, slst in next stitch of the hair cap.
- **1** ch8 flo of chain slst, 6sc, slst in next stitch of the hair cap.

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.



Insert your hook in the 19th marked stitch.



Pull up a loop.



Make a chain of 8



After the slst + 6sc, slst in next stitch on hair cap.



Part C: after working on the chain, insert your hook in next stitch of hair cap.



Pull up a loop.



Insert your hook in next stitch of hair cap.



Pull up a loop.



Pull up a loop and pass your yarn through the three loops on your hook.



Fringe

Reverse again your hair cap so that it is in the same sense as when you crocheted it. Make your first slst just under your ro of 11 slst **rnd 15**, your first slst is just under your marked st (picture 40). So one stitch before your 11 slst.

Ousing pastel yellow:

Rnd 1: make 13 surface slst between rnd 14 and 15 (picture 41). Fasten off and cut yarn. Insert your hook in the first surface slst (picture 42), work only in the flo of the surface slst. For the chains here, always start from 2^{nd} chain from hook and on the flo of chain.

- 🔼 ch5 slst, 3sc, slst in next surface slst. (picture 43)
- 📵 ch10 sc, 8hdc, skip one stitch and slst in next surface slst. (picture 44)
- sc, {hdc, dc}, {tr, ch picot, tr}, {dc, hdc}, sc, slst (picture 45 to 47)
- ch9 sc, 7hdc, skip one stitch and slst in next surface slst.
- 📵 ch5 slst, 3sc, slst in next surface slst.

Fasten off and cut yarn.





Make 13 surface slst and fasten off.



Insert your hook in flo of the first slst.



Make a ch of 5.



Work on your h10, skip the first slst of surface and slst in the next.



Make a tr and ch1.



Make a picot ch: ch1, insert your hook in the 2 loops formed by the tr and slst.



Continue part C.




The finish.

Diamonds

To do the little diamonds, we use a thinner With saffron: yarn. Separate it in two: one with 2 strands and the second with 3 strands.

I used approximately 50cm. (picture 48-49).







Left: 3 brins Right: 2 brins.

Diamonds on the crown

Use the 2 strands-yarn and a 1,25mm hook.

- Make 2 in **sky blue** and 2 in **red**:
- Rnd 1: MR6, mc in first stitch. Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

Diamond on the dress

Use the 3 strands-yarn and a 1,5mm hook.

Start with **sky blue**/

Rnd 1: MR8 [8]

Change to saffron

Rnd 2: blo - slst around [8]

Cut and fasten off the invisible way (picture 50-51).



next stitch.



Insert your needle in Insert your needle back in the sist and sc.



Your 4 diamonds and the chest diamond.

Crown

Rnd 1: ch16

Rnd 2: sc in the first ch. make sure not to twist it, sc around (picture 53-54) [16]

Rnd 3: (slst, hdc, {dc, ch1 picot, dc}, hdc) * 4, slst in first stitch (picture 55) [16] Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.



Ch 16 and insert your hook in the first chain.



sc around, make sure not to twist the chain.





Dc, ch1 and make a picot ch: insert your hook in the two loops formed by the dc and slst.

Right arm

Ousing white:

Rnd 1: MR6 [6]

Rnd 2: (sc, inc) * 3 [9]

Rnd 3: sc around [9]

Rnd 4: 3sc, 2dec, 2sc [7].

Stuff the hand firmly but stuff the rest of the arm lightly or not at all so that it falls off nicely on the body.

Rnd 5-6: sc around [7] - 2 rnds

Change to nude, cut white

Rnd 7: blo - 7sc [7] (picture 57)

Semi-change to pink

Rnd 8: 7sc (picture 58-60) [7]

Change to pink, cute nude

Rnd 9: blo - 7sc [7]

Rnd 10: sc around [7]

Flatten the opening of the arm so that the stitches of the last round line up.

Rnd 11: blo - 3slst through both layers (picture 61).

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

With your palm facing downward, attach white yarn in the flo of rnd 6 (picture 62)

Rnd 1: (ch2, slst in next stitch) repeat around. (picture 63-64). Fasten off.

With your palm facing **downward**, attach **pink** in the **last flo** of **rnd 10** (picture 65)

Rnd 1: flo - ch2, dc in first flo of arm, 2dc, 3inc-dc, then dc in the last flo of arm where you started your ch2 (picture 65 to 67)

Now, fold the **rnd 1**, so that it covers the arm, the "wrong" side is now outside (picture 68).

Insert your hook in the **flo** of **rnd 8 of the arm** and on **flo of rnd 1** of the **sleeves**:

Rnd 2: slst around [9]

Make the first slst on **the ch2** of the **sleeve** and the **flo** of **rnd 8** of the **arm** (*picture 70*), when you slst for the inc-dc, slst each time in the same **flo** of **rnd 8** (*picture 71-72*).

For the last dc, there shouldn't be any more **flo** from **rnd 8** free, simply slst in the dc

Fasten off and cut yarn.



BLO - sc around



Start the semi-colour change:
Your last YO from rnd 7 is in pink.
Rnd 8: your first YU is in nude and your second YO is is pink. Do this for the rnd.



As you do, twist the two strands of yarn so that it keeps a sc aspect.



Flatten the arm opening: blo - 3 slst



Palm facing down, insert hook on first flo of rnd 6.



Pull up a loop and ch 2.



Make one last slst on the flo you made your first ch2.



Left arm

Because of the shape of the palm, the left arm is a little bit different: we do the colour change 2sc before the end of rnd.

Ousing white:

Do **rnd 1** to **rnd 5** as the right arm then:

Rnd 6: 5sc, Change to nude - blo - 2sc [7]

Rnd 7: blo - 5sc semi-change to pink, both loops - 2sc [7]

Rnd 8: semi-change to pink, 5sc, change to pink - blo - 2sc (picture 58-60) [7]
Cut off the nude.

Rnd 9: blo - 5sc, both loops - 2sc [7]

Rnd 10: sc around [7]

Flatten the opening of the arm so that the stitches of the last round line up.

Rnd 11: blo - 3slst through both layers (picture 61).

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

With your palm facing **downward**, attach **white** in the **flo** of **rnd 6** (picture 62)

Rnd 1: (ch2, slst in next stitch) repeat around. (picture 63-64). Fasten off.

With your palm facing downward, attach **pink** yarn in the **flo** of **rnd 10** (picture 65)

Rnd 1: flo - ch2, inc-dc in first flo of arm, 2inc-dc, 3dc, then dc in the last flo of arm where you started your ch2 (picture 65 to 67).

Insert your hook in the flo of rnd 8 of the arm and on flo of rnd 1 of the sleeves:

Rnd 2: slst around [9]

Fasten off and cut yarn.

See right arm for more explanations.





How the arm should look like. A: after rnd 11 (slst) B: final result.



Insert your hook on the last flo of rnd 10.



Pull up a loop and ch2.



Insert your hook in first flo of rnd 10, make a dc.



Fold the dc, the "wrong" side is now outside and it covers the arm.



Insert hook in flo of the ch2 and the flo of rnd 8 of the arm.



Insert your hook in flo of rnd 8 of the arm and on the flo of the dc.



When you have an inc-dc, make each slst in the same flo of the arm.

Assembly

- 1. Sew the arms between **rnds 2 and 3** of the body *(picture 73)*. Pass your needle through 2 stitches on the body and through 2 dc of the sleeves *(picture 74-755)*. Do this a few times.
- 2. Sew or glue the hair on the head, see *(picture 81)*. Be sure to "level" the hair so that there isn't one side longer than the other on each side and that the "pic" of the fringe is right in the middle. For the strands of hair from each side of the "pic": you take the 2 strands (A & B-slst) from the surface slst *(picture 79)* and the first strands of hair (A-cap) from the hair cap and you twist it a little.
- 3. Sew or glue the four diamonds on the crown (picture 80)
- 4. Sew or glue the big diamond on Peach's chest, on round below her chin. (picture 81)
- 5. Embroider the nose between the **rnd 12 and 13**. See next page for instructions.
- 6. Sew or glue the crown on Peach's head. If you sew it, sew if from the inside so that the crown looses a little volume. I glued it on her head.



Nose embroidery



Insert your needle between rnd 12 & 13.



Pass a few times your needle between the string we just formed.



Final result



Insert your needle two stitches on the left.









Mario -

Body

For the head see page 4. (you can click here to go there)

Holding your head **upside down**, connect **red** to the last remaining **flo** of **rnd 4**, then insert your hook in first **flo** of **rnd 4** to make your first sc of **rnd 1** (picture 1-2).

Rnd 1: flo - (5sc, inc) * 4 [28]

Rnd 2: 3sc, inc, (6s, inc) *3, 3sc [32]

Rnd 3-6: sc around [32] - 4 rnds

Change to blue, cut red

Rnd 7: slst around [32]

Rnd 8: insert your hook in **blo** of the previous round (the slip stitch round) and in both loop of **rnd 6** (picture 3-4) - (7sc, inc) * 4 [36]

Start stuffing and continue as you go.

Rnd 9-14: sc around [36] - 6 rnds

When you're almost finished with the doll be careful **not to stuff too much** or your

Change to brown, cut blue

Rnd 15: blo - (7sc, dec) * 4 [32]

Rnd 16: 1sc, dec, (2sc, dec) *7, 1sc [24]

Rnd 17: (1sc, dec) * 8 [16]

Finish stuffing.

Rnd 18: 8dec [8]

Fasten off, leave a tail to weave in.

With your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of the remaining stitch and pull it tight to close the body. Weave in the yarn end.

Holding the body upside down, connect **brown** yarn to the last remaining front loop of **rnd 14**:

Rnd 1: flo - sc around (picture 5-6)

Rnd 2: slst around

Cut and fasten off the invisible way.



Insert your hook in the last flo of round 5.



Pull up a loop, insert your hook in the first flo of round 5.



Insert your hook in blo of slst rnd 7 + in both loop of sc rnd 6.



This is what it should look like after rnd 8.



Insert your hook in blo of rnd 14. sc ground.



Skip one stitch and insert your needle in next stitch, insert it back in your last stitch.



Overalls

Holding your body the head **facing up** (picture 7)

Using blue:

Rnd 1: insert hook in last flo rnd7: ch1 and slst in same flo. Make a round of slst in the flo of rnd 7 [32].

Fasten off and cut yarn (picture 7-8).

Front of the overalls

Count (counterclockwise) 18 slst, and insert your hook in the 19th slst. (picture 9-10)

Rnd 1: ch1 and flo - sc in the same slst. flo - sc in the next 7 slst, ch1 and turn [8]

Rnd 2-3: 8sc, ch1 and turn [8]

Rnd 4: ch10 cut yarn and leave a loop, we'll use it later. (picture 11)

Back of the overalls

Count 8 slst from the first slst free on your left, and attach yarn on the 9th (picture 12):

Rnd 1: ch1 and flo-sc in the same slst, flosc in the next 7 slst, ch1 and turn [8] Rnd 2-3: 8sc, ch1 and turn [8]

Rnd 4: ch10 and slst in the first sc of the front overalls. (picture 13).

Fasten off and cut yarn.

Take back the ch10 from the front overalls and slst in first sc of the back overalls (picture 14).

Fasten off and cut yarn.

Button

Same as for Peach, divide your yarn into three parts: two with 2 strands and one with the 1 strand. (I used 25cm of strands)

Using **yellow**, with a 1,25mm hook and the 2 strand-yarn:






Assembly

- 3. Sew or glue the hair on the head, see *(picture 45)*. Count from the eyes: there should be **5 rnds** before the top of the hair on the head.
- 4. Sew the nose (pass your needle only in the **flo** of the nose: it make it easier to sew) on **rnds 14 & 16** (picture 38-39)
- 5. Sew or glue the moustache below the nose. The sides should go up a little below the eyes (picture 40-43).
- 6. Make the letter embroidery for the symbol, and sew or glue it onto the hat (next page).
- 7. Sew or glue the little buttons on the overalls, just at the hedges of the part on the front.
- 8. Sew or glue the lock of hair between **rnd 4 & 5** on Mario's left on the hair cap (picture 44-45).

Body

For the head see page 4. (you can click here to go there)

Holding your head **upside down**, connect **black** yarn to the last remaining **flo** of **rnd 4**, then insert your hook in first **flo** of **rnd 4** to make your first sc of **rnd 1** (picture 1-2).

Rnd 1: flo - (5sc, inc) * 4 [28]

Rnd 2-6: sc around [28] - 5 rnds

Rnd 7: (5sc, dec) * 4 [24]

Rnd 8: flo - (sc, inc) * 12 [36] (picture 3)

Rnd 9: (5sc, inc) * 6 [42]

Start stuffing and continue as you go.

Rnd 10-18: sc around [42] - 9 rnds

Rnd 19: blo - (5sc, dec) * 6 [36]

Rnd 20: 2sc, dec, (4sc, dec) * 5, 2sc [30]

Rnd 21: (3sc, dec) * 6 [24]

Finish stuffing.

When you're almost finish with the doll be careful **not to stuff too much** or the bottom will bulge and your Daisy won't be able to stand right.

Rnd 22: (sc, dec) * 8 [16]

Rnd 23: 8dec [8]

Fasten off, leave a tail to weave in.

Rnd 2: flo - slst, inc-sc, inc-hdc, (inc-dc) * 2, tr, inc-tr, tr, (inc-dc) * 2, inc-hdc, inc-sc, slst, inc-sc, inc-hdc, (inc-dc) *2, tr, inc-tr, tr, (inc-dc) * 2, inc-hdc, inc-sc, slst.

Rnd 3: slst in first slst, **blo** - 20slst, next slst don't do it on the 2 loops but just below the two loops, **blo** - 21slst [43]. **Do one more slst** (picture 27).

Leave the remaining 2 stitches unworked. Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

Left part

Using caramel yarn

ch9 + ch2 - start from 4th chain from hook, back bump of chain - {4tr}, {1tr, ch3 - slst in first chain and picot in tr, 1tr}, inc-dc, dc, inc-hdc, hdc, inc, slst.

Fasten off and make a knot with the two strings of yarn.

Attach yarn to the 4th chain (count from the finish, on the other side of the chain) (picture 36), ch3 - start from 2nd chain from hook - [slst, inc], slst in next stitch, ch1, {dc, 1tr}, inc-tr, slst in 4th chain from part A (picture 37).

Rnd 2: ch1, {hdc, ch1, slst, ch1} *3, ch1, hdc, ch1, and slst in the slst rnd 1.

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing (picture 47).

Diamond on the dress

Use the 2 strands-yarn and a 1,25mm hook

Rnd 1: MR6 + Change to white slst in first Sc [6]

With your palm facing downward, attach **yellow** yarn in the first **flo** of **rnd 11** (picture 56 to 58)

Now fold **rnd 1**, so that it covers the arm, the "wrong" side is now outside (picture 59).

Rnd 12: blo - 3slst through both layers Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

With your palm facing **downward**, attach **white** in the **flo** of rnd 5.

Rnd 1: (ch2, slst in next stitch) repeat around (picture 53-54). Fasten off and cut yarn.

With your palm facing **downward**, attach **yellow** in the **flo** of **rnd 11** (picture 56 to 58)

Rnd 1: flo - ch2, inc-dc in first flo of arm, 2inc-dc, 3dc, then dc in the last flo of arm where you started your ch2.

Insert your hook in the flo of rnd 9 of the arm and on flo of rnd 1 of the sleeves:

Rnd 2: slst around [9].

With your palm facing downward, attach white yarn in the flo of rnd 8.

Rnd 1: (ch2, slst in next stitch) repeat around (picture 60-61).

Fasten off and cut yarn.

Assembly

- 1. Sew the arms between round 2 and 3 of the body (picture 62 to 63). Pass a few times your needle through 2 stitches on the body and through 2 dc of the sleeves (picture 64).
- 2. Sew or glue the hair on the head, see *(picture 65-66)*. Be sure to "level" the hair so that there isn't one side longer than the other on each side and that each little lock of hair is more or less two stitches apart from the eye *(picture 65)*. The hair is 4 stitches above the eyes. Glue 2/3 of the hair strings *(picture 66)*.
- 3. Sew or glue the fringe. The little "pics" are 2 stitches above the eyes, sew/glue only the center piece, leave the two locks (picture 70). When putting it on her hair, make it a little puffy so that it has a little volume (you can even add a bit of fiber fill). To add volume, sew only the **blo** (picture 71-72).
- 4. Sew or glue the fours diamonds on the crown (picture 68)
- 5. Sew or glue the big diamonds on Daisy's chest, one round below her chin. (picture 69)
- 6. Embroider the nose between the round 12 and 13. See "nose embroidery" for instructions.
- 7. Sew or glue the crown on Daisy's head. If you sew it, sew if from the inside so that the crown looses a little bit of volume. I glued it on her head.







- 5. Sew or glue the moustache below the nose. The sides should go up a little below the eyes. (picture 48)
- 6. Make the letter embroidery for the symbol, and sew or glue it onto the hat (next page).
- 7. Sew or glue the little buttons on the overalls, just at the hedges of the part on the front.
- 8. Sew or glue the lock of hair between rnd 4 & 5 on Luigi's left on the hair cap (picture 49).

Rnd 6: <u>(2sc, inc) * 2, 2sc</u>, blo - {in the same stitch: [B] 1sc, [G] 1sc}, <u>both loops - (2sc, inc) * 3</u>, blo - [B] 1sc, <u>both loops - [G] 1sc, inc</u> [28]

Rnd 7: [G] 7sc, blo - [Be] 2sc, [B] 3sc, [Be] 2sc, both loops - [G] 7sc, blo - [Be] 2sc, [B] 3sc, [Be] 2sc [28]

Rnd 8: *blo - [B] 2sc, [Be] sc, dec, [B] 2sc, both loops - [Be] 2sc, [B] sc, dec, [Be] 2sc.
Repeat from * one more time [24]

Change to beige, cut all the other colours

Rnd 9: sc around [24]

Stuff the shell.

Rnd 10: (sc, dec) * 8 [16]

Rnd 11: 8dec [8]

Fasten off and cut yarn.

With your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of the remaining stitches and pull it tight to close it. Weave in the yarn end.

With the top of the shell facing down, insert **white** yarn in the last **flo rnd 6**, YU then insert your hook in first **flo rnd 6**:

ORnd 1: 10sc, inc, 13sc, inc, 3sc [30]

The inc are made on the highest flo, which is just above the **black** 3sc (picture 3).

Rnd 2: slst around [30]

Using **beige**:

Rnd 1: Ch 7

Fasten off, leave a tail to weave in.

We will sew them on each side of the shell around the opening for **the head and tail** (pictures 10 to 12).









This is what you should get after rnd 11.





Using white, sc all around the flo from rnd 6. When you get on the highest flo: inc.



Final look.



The two chains.

Assembly

Sew your two chains on each side of the shell, around the 2 "holes" (pictures 9 to 12). Also sew the **back bump** of the 3rd and 4th chains under **rnd 8** (picture 11-12).

With your **black** yarn, embroider around the different "holes" for the legs, tail and head if some **beige** yarn is visible from your colour changes (picture 13-14).

With a thinner and darker yarn, embroider the shell (pictures 15 to 17) separating the shell into 6.

Make two little diagonals line on the last **rnd** before the edge (make a V), then, make a circle encircling **rnd 2**. Then make 6 big lines starting from the joining point of your V and arriving under **rnd 2**, securing the circle formed before.

Blue shell

Follow all the steps of the Koopa Shell changing green to blue.

Peak (make seven)

Ousing white:

Rnd 1: ch3 - start from 2nd chain from hook and on back bump - slst, hdc, ch1.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew / glue the peaks around the shell:

- 1. One at the top, on the MR.
- 2. The other 6 between **rnd 4 and 5** in each space made from the embroidery with the thinner yarn (pictures 18 to 19).
























After doing the 6 little V's, insert your needle under rnd 2, pull the thread and encercle rnd 2, then insert your needle back where you came (picture 17).
