# MATERIALS AND TOOLS

• Yarn Vita Cotton Pelican (50g/330m,100% double mercerized cotton)

For the body, head, legs, ears and muzzle of unicorn and cow

3993 - milk

- 3952 black
- 3956 pink powder
- Yarn YarnArt Canarias (20 g/203 m, 100% mercerized cotton)
- For unicorn curls
- 4915 knapweed
- 5352 green apple
- 5307 yellow
- 0008 turquoise

6328 - red

- For unicorn and cow horns
- 5326 gray

You can use any yarn you have.

 Crochet hook - size 0,9 mm (for Vita Cotton Pelican yarn) and size 0,75 mm (for YarnArt Canarias yarn)

or any other suitable for the thickness of your yarn and your crocheting density.



- Toy filler.
- Tool for stuffing.
- Needles for sewing.
- Scissors.
- Safety pins for markings.
- Pins for row markings. Contrast thread may be used.
- Eyes. I use round eyes with stem size 3 mm. Can be replaced with small buttons.
- Glue Moment Crystal, glue second Gel.
- Fabric marker, oil or dry pastels for toning. Brushes.

Remember that the hook number must be less than the size or two recommended on the label. It will be harder to knit, but there will be no holes on the fabric. Experiment, crochet a sample, and you will surely find a suitable hook for yourself.

Perhaps over time you will reduce the size of the hook.

The size of the finished toy depends on the thickness of the yarn, the hook used and the crocheting density. When using these materials, the size of the toy is about 5-7 cm.

# ABBREVIATIONS

AR - amigurumi ring ch - chain sc - single crochet dc - double crochet hdc - half double crochet sl st - slip stitch inc - increase dec - decrease (...)\*n - number of repetitions (...) - total number of stitches in a row

The basis for the unicorn and the cow is the same.

The differences are only in the descriptions of the horns and the presence of curls. And also there are slight differences in the assembly.



# **LEGS (4 details)**

Start with a black thread

row 5 sc into AR (5)
row INC\*5 (10)
row (1 sc, INC)\*5 (15)
Next, let's prepare the insoles. Circle the sole on cardboard or plastic and cut out. Prepare for all legs at once.
row back loop only 15 sc (15)

Change to milk color **5 row** 15 sc (15)

Insert the insole inside.

6 row (3 sc, DEC)\*3 (12) 7-8 row (2 rows) 12 sc (12) 9 row (2 sc, DEC)\*3 (9)

Add filler, do not add filler further.

**10 row** 9 sc (9) **11 row** (1 sc, DEC)\*3 (6)

Leave a thread and sew remaining opening grabbing both edges.

Leave thread for sewing to the body.









# BODY

Crochet with milk thread

1 row 6 sc into AR (6) 2 row INC\*6 (12) 3 row (1 sc, INC)\*6 (18) 4 row (2 sc, INC)\*6 (24) 5 row (3 sc, INC)\*6 (30) 6 row (4 sc, INC)\*6 (36) 7-11 row (5 rows) 36 sc (36) 12 row (4 sc, DEC)\*6 (30) 13-14 row (2 rows) 30 sc (30) 15 row (4 sc, DEC)\*5 (25) 16 row 25 sc (25) 17 row (3 sc, DEC)\*5 (20) 18 row 20 sc (20)



Add filler.

Leave thread for sewing.

# HEAD

Make 18 ch with milk thread

row from the second chain from the hook crochet 16 sc on the chain, 3 sc into the last ch, on the other side of chain 15 sc, INC (36)
row INC, 15 sc, 3INC, 15 sc, 2INC (42)
row 1 sc, INC, 15 sc, (INC, 1 sc)\*3, 15 sc, (1 sc, INC)\*2 (48)
4 row 48 sc (48)

**5 row** 2 sc, INC, 15 sc, (INC, 2 sc)\*3, 15 sc, (2 sc, INC)\*2 (54)

**6-21 row** (16 rows) 54 sc (54)


Crochet 2 sc and shift the row beginning. 22 row 1 sc, DEC, 18 sc, (DEC, 1 sc)\*3, 18 sc, (1 sc, DEC)\*2 (48)

 row 1 sc, DEC, 15 sc, (DEC, 1 sc)\*3, 15 sc, (1 sc, DEC)\*2 (42) row 1 sc, DEC, 12 sc, (DEC, 1 sc)\*3, 12 sc, (1 sc, DEC)\*2 (36) row 1 sc, DEC, 9 sc, (DEC, 1 sc)\*3, 9 sc, (1 sc, DEC)\*2 (30) row 1 sc, DEC, 7 sc, (DEC, 1 sc)\*3, 7 sc, (1 sc, DEC)\*2 (24)



On this finish crocheting, leave longer thread.

Add filler and sew remaining opening grabbing both edges.



### MUZZLE

Crochet with milk thread

**1 row** 6 sc into AR (6) **2 row** INC\*6 (12) **3 row** 12 sc (12)

Leave thread for sewing.



# EARS (2 details)

Make 7 ch


**1 row** from the second chain from the hook 2 sc, 2 hdc, 1 sc, 3 sc into the last ch, on the other side 1 sc, 2 hdc, 2 sc

#### Crochet 2 parts for each ear.

First, crochet the inner part *with a pink thread*, fasten and hide the thread at the end.

Next, crochet the outer part *with a milk thread*, do not cut the thread.

Next, connect both parts with the wrong sides inward.



And make binding, placing the parts with the inner part facing us, grab both edges: 6 sc, 3 sc into 1, 6 sc.

Fold the ear in half and sew. Leave the thread for sewing.



We crocheted the main part, the rest details of the toys are different.

# UNICORN

## HORN

Gray thread

1 row 6 sc into AR (6) 2 row 6 sc (6) 3 row (1 sc, INC)\*3 (9) 4 row 9 sc (9) 5 row (2 sc, INC)\*3 (12) 6 row 12 sc (12) 7 row (3 sc, INC)\*3 (15)

Leave thread for sewing.



# **CURLS**

Make a chain of 26 ch.

From the second chain from the hook, crochet 2 sc into each chain, so the chain will begin to twist.

Leave the thread for sewing.


In total, we need to crochet 10 curls (2 of each color), more or less can be.





**ASSEMBLY** 

First, make the embroidery on the muzzle, as shown in the photo (1).




Sew the muzzle to the head.


The lower part of the muzzle is located in the region of the 18th row, the upper part is in the region of the 14th row, according to the position in the middle of the front of the head (2-4).

Insert the eyes between 14-15 rows, back 2-4 stitches from the edge of the muzzle (5).


Sew on the ears on the edges of the top of the head, in the area of the 3rd row. The ears look up (6-7).




Sew on the horn in 4-7 rows of the head. Center it over the ears (8-10).



Sew on the curls on the top of the head, distributing them between the ears (11-13).



Sew the body to the head (14-16).



Sew the legs to the body (17-20) (This option can also be used for the cow)


Sew the front legs next to each other in the center of the body in the 12th row of the body.

Sew the lower legs in different directions in the region of the 4th row of the body.

To prevent the legs from dangling, grab them with several stitches in the middle of the legs to the body.









Make a tail (21). In the area of the butt, grab several threads and braid a pigtail of the required length, make a knot at the end and cut off the tassel.

A tail can be made by simply tying three multi-colored curls.

# Crochet toy pattern «UNICORN and COW» Irina Rybolovleva

# COW'S HORNS (2 details)

Gray thread

**1 row** 6 sc into AR (6) **2 row** 6 sc (6) **3 row** (1 sc, INC)\*3 (9) **4 row** 9 sc (9)

Leave thread for sewing

# ASSEMBLY

First, make the embroidery on the muzzle, as shown in the photo (1).

Sew the muzzle to the head (2). The lower part of the muzzle is located in the region of the 18th row, the upper part is in the region of the 14th row, according to the position in the middle of the front of the head.

Insert the eyes between 14-15 rows, back 2-4 stitches from the edge of the muzzle (3).

Sew on the ears on the edges of the top of the head, in the area of the 3rd row. The ears look down (4-5).





COW





Sew on the horns in the area of 3-5 rows in front. There are 9-11 stitches between the horns (6-7).

Sew the body to the head (8).







Sew the legs to the body (9-10) (This option can also be used for the unicorn)

Sew the upper legs on the sides - in the region of the 13-14 rows of the body, the lower ones - in the region of the 7-8 rows of the body.

To prevent the legs from sticking out in different directions, moisten them well with water, including the sewing place (moisten them with plenty of water). Fix the limbs in the desired position with needles and leave to dry completely.






#### Make a tail (11-12).

In the area of the butt, grab several threads and braid a pigtail of the required length, make a knot at the end and cut off the tassel.





Draw spots with a special fabric marker. Let it dry for 24 hours (13-14).
