This document is a crochet toy pattern.

On its pages you will find a lot of photos of the crocheting process and detailed instructions.

To make this toy you need to have basic crochet skills.

The toy measures 28 cm (11 inches) approximately if you use recommended materials.

You should crochet tightly to avoid holes. If you crochet freely, try to use a smaller crochet hook. Stuff the toy firmly, don't spare stuffing. Make sure there is no empty space left. Stuff hard-to-reach areas with the help of a wooden stick. This will make your toy look neat and keep good shape.

Details are started with a magic ring (MR) and crocheted in continuous rounds in a spiral unless the other method is specified.

Wish you enjoy crocheting!





## **MATERIALS YOU NEED:**

- Yarn Gazzal Baby Cotton (60% cotton/ 40% acrylic, 50 g/ 165 m (1,76 oz/180 yd)) – beige (3445), white (3410), olive (3464), red (3453), brown (3436), dark beige (3424), emerald (3467), yellow (3413), orange (3465)
- brown thread for embroidery the eyebrows, black thread for embroidery the eyes, (I used Gazzal Baby Cotton or embroidery thread)
- Crochet hook 2 mm
- Fiberfill
- Scissors
- Wooden stick (for filling with fiber some small pieces)
- 5 buttons
- Sewing needle
- Pins
- Brown sewing thread for sewing on hair

## **ABBREVIATIONS:**

**MR** – magic ring  
**ch st** – chain stitch  
**sc** – single crochet  
**hdc** – half double crochet  
**dc** – double crochet  
**sl st** – slip stitch  
**inc** – increase (crochet 2 sc in 1 st)

## HEAD

(crochet with *beige* yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR  
r2 - 6 inc (12)  
r3 - (1 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (18)  
r4 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (24)  
r5 - (3 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (30)  
r6 - (4 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (36)  
r7 - (5 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (42)  
r8 - (6 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (48)  
r9 - (7 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (54)  
r10-21 (**12 rounds**) - 54 sc  
r22 - (7 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (48)  
r23 - (6 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (42)  
r24 - (5 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (36)  
r25 - (4 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (30)

Start stuffing the head, then stuff as you go.

r26 - (3 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (24)  
r27 - (2 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (18)  
r28 - (1 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (12)

Stuff the head firmly. Crochet 1 sl st. Cut the thread and fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



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## EARS

(make 2, crochet with *beige* yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

Don't join the round in a circle, fasten off and cut the thread, leaving a long tail for sewing.



## HAIR

(crochet with **brown** yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

r2 - 6 inc (12)

r3 - (1 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (18)

r4 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (24)

Next, crochet **strands** of hair.

r5 - 1 sl st, ch 16, from the 3rd chain from the hook 13 hdc, 1 sc along the chain, 1 sl st,

ch 14, from the 3rd chain from the hook 11 hdc, 1 sc along the chain, 1 sl st,

(ch 10, from the 3rd chain from the hook 7 hdc, 1 sc along the chain, 1 sl st) \*5,

ch 14, from the 3rd chain from the hook 11 hdc, 1 sc along the chain, 1 sl st,

ch 16, from the 3rd chain from the hook 13 hdc, 1 sc along the chain, 1 sl st,

(ch 28, from the 3rd chain from the hook 25 hdc, 1 sc along the chain, 1 sl st) \*15

Cut the thread and fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



Mark with pins two points on the 18th round, leaving 10 sts apart.

**Embroider the eyes** with black thread, making 4-5 stitches. Then **embroider the eyelashes**.



**Embroider the eyebrows** between the 15th and 16th rounds leaving 8 sts apart with **brown** thread. The width of the eyebrow is 2 sc.

**Embroider the nose** between the 19th and 20th rounds with 2 stitches with **beige** thread. The width of the nose is 2 sc.



***Sew on the ears*** between the 18th and 21th rounds, at a distance of 7 sc from the eye.





**Fix the hair** on the head with pins as shown in the picture. **Fix strands** of hair on the back of the head through one - 2nd, 4th, 6th, and so on down, 1st, 3rd, 5th, and so on from above.

**Sew the hair to the head** with the back-stitch only at the top (along the edge of the 4th round).

Try don't tighten the thread too much to avoid unevenness along the sewing line.



**Sew strands of hair** with brown sewing thread with the back-stitch.



## HANDS

(make 2, start to crochet with **beige** yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

r2 - (1 sc, 1 inc) \*3 (9)

r3-5 (**3 rounds**) - 9 sc

r6 - 4 sc, 1 "bobble stitch" consisting of 3 dc, 4 sc (9)

r7 - 4 sc, 1 dec, 3 sc (8)

r8-9 (**2 rounds**) - 8 sc

r10 - 1 inc, 7 sc (9)

r11-13 (**3 rounds**) - 9 sc

r14 - 1 inc, 8 sc (10)

r15-20 (**6 rounds**) - 10 sc

Start stuffing the hand, then stuff as you go.

Work some shift stitches, so the beginning of rounds will be exactly at the back side of the hand (I crocheted 4 sc).

Change the yarn to **olive**.

r21 - 10 sl st

r22 - 10 sc (work through two layers, in back loops only of the 21th round (**olive** yarn) and into both loops of the 20th round (**beige** yarn))

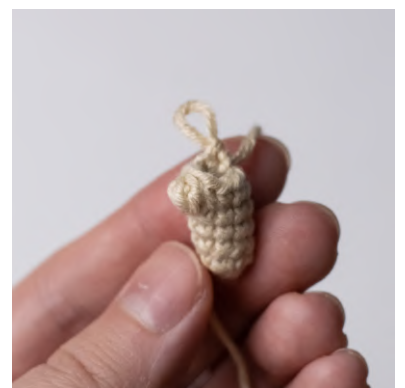
r23-33 (**11 rounds**) - 10 sc

**Fill the hands** up to about the 28th round.

Work some shift stitches, so the beginning of rounds will be exactly at the back side of the hand (I crocheted 3 sc).

Now fold the piece in half and crochet **5 sc** through two layers.

Cut and fasten off the thread, hide the end inside of the hand.





## LEGS

(make 2, start to crochet with **white** yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

r2 - 6 inc (12)

r3-7 (**5 rounds**) - 12 sc

Next, crochet the heel in **rows**.

Make 1 sl st, 1 ch, turn the work.

r8 - 3 sc, 1 sl st into the 4th st (on the round 7),  
ch 1, turn your work.

r9 - 4 sc, 1 sl st into the 5th st (on the round 7),  
ch 1, turn your work.

r10 - 5 sc, 1 sl st into the 6th st (on the round  
7), ch 1, turn your work.

Next, continue to crochet in **rounds**.

r11 - 12 sc



r12 - 2 sc, 1 dec, 8 sc (11)  
r13-15 (**3 rounds**) - 11 sc

Work some shift stitches, so the beginning of rounds will be exactly above the heel (I crocheted 4 sc).

**\* Don't cut the white thread.** Leave it in front of your work (as shown in the picture).  
With this white thread we will crochet along the edge of the socks.

Change the yarn to **beige**.

r16 - 11 sc (in back loops only)  
r17 - 11 sc  
r18 - 10 sc, 1 inc (12)

Start stuffing the leg, then stuff as you go.

Now we are going to crochet **along the edge of the socks**. For this, use the **white** thread that we left in front. Work into front loops of the round 15.

Flip the leg over as shown in the picture.

r1 - 11 sc

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.

Continue to crochet the leg.

r19-29 (**11 rounds**) - 12 sc  
r30 - 6 sc, 2 inc, 4 sc (14) - make sure that the increases are exactly on the front of the leg.  
r31 - 7 sc, 2 dec, 3 sc (12)  
r32-34 (**3 rounds**) - 12 sc  
r35 - (5 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (14)  
r36-38 (**3 rounds**) - 14 sc  
r39 - (6 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (16)  
r40-46 (**7 rounds**) - 16 sc



- leave the thread in front of your work.



Work 1-2 shift stitches, so the beginning of rounds will be exactly on the side of the leg.

Change the yarn to **white**.

r47-49 (**3 rounds**) - 16 sc

**Stuff the leg** till the round 43 approximately.

Work 1-2 shift stitches, so the beginning of rounds will be exactly on the side of the leg.

Now fold the piece in half and crochet **8 sc** through two layers.

Cut and fasten off the thread, hide the end inside of the leg.



## **BODY**

(start to crochet with **white** yarn)

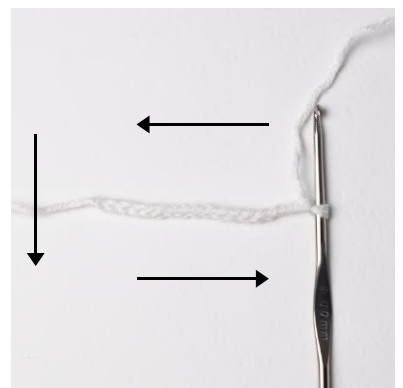
Make 18 ch, then start crocheting from the second ch from the hook:

r1 - 1 inc, 15 sc, 4 sc in 1 st, 15 sc, 1 inc (38)

r2 - 2 inc, 15 sc, 4 inc, 15 sc, 2 inc (46)

r3 - 46 sc

In the next round we will **attach the legs**.



r4 - 2 sc, 8 sc (both through leg and body), 3 sc, 8 sc (both through leg and body), 25 sc (46)  
r5-11 (**7 rounds**) - 46 sc  
r12 - 3 sc, 1 dec, 13 sc, 1 dec, 6 sc, 1 dec, 13 sc, 1 dec, 3 sc (42)  
r13-15 (**3 rounds**) - 42 sc  
r16 - (5 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (36)  
r17 - 36 sc

\* **Don't cut the white thread.** Leave it in front of your work (as shown in the picture).

With this white thread we will crochet along the top of the panties.

Change the yarn to **beige**.

r18 - 36 sc (in back loops only)  
r19-21 (**3 rounds**) - 36 sc

Change the yarn to **olive**.

r22 - 36 sl st  
r23 - 36 sc (work through two layers, in back loops only of the 22th round (**olive** yarn) and into both loops of the 21th round (**beige** yarn))  
r24-26 (**3 rounds**) - 36 sc  
r27 - (4 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (30)  
r28 - 30 sc

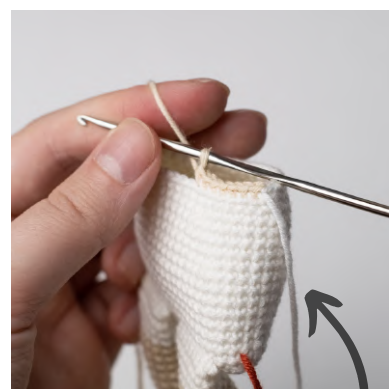
Start stuffing the body, then stuff as you go.

Now we are going to crochet along the **top of the panties**. For this, use the white thread that we left in front. Work into front loops of the round 17.

r1 - 36 sc

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.

Continue to crochet the **body**.



leave the thread in front of your work.

In the next round we will **attach the hands**.

\* Make sure that the hands are located exactly on the sides of the body. Remove 1 shift stitch if needed.

r29 - 5 sc (both through hand and body), 10 sc,  
5 sc (both through hand and body), 10 sc (30)

r30 - (3 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (24)

r31 - (2 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (18)

**Stuff the body** firmly.

\* **Don't cut the olive thread.** Leave it in front of your work (as shown in the picture).

With this white thread we will crochet along the neck.

Change the yarn to **beige**.

Next we will **crochet the neck**. Please note that it will go into the hole inside the head until the 34th row.

**Crochet and stuff the neck tightly**, this is important! If the neck is too long, shorten it by a couple of rounds.

r32 - (1 sc, 1 dec) \*6 (12) - in back loops only

r33-40 (**8 rounds**) - 12 sc

**Stuff the neck tightly.**

r41 - 6 dec (6)

Cut the thread and fasten off . Close the remaining hole using a needle. Insert the needle under front loops only and pull the opening closed. Then insert it into the center and weave in end.



**Now we are going to crochet along the neck.** For this, use the olive thread that we left in front. Work into front loops of the round 31.

r1 - 18 sc

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.



leave the thread in front of your work.



**Remove some filler** from the opening of the head so that the neck enters it. **Insert the neck** into the hole up to the 34th round.

**Sew the head to the body** with invisible seam.







## SKIRT

(crochet with **red** yarn)

\* Crochet the skirt not as tightly as a doll. For convenience, you can take a slightly larger hook (for example, 2.25 mm or 2.5 mm, instead of 2 mm).

Crochet in **rows**.

Every row starts with turning chains - 1st and 2nd rows starts with 1 ch, from 3rd to 15th rows starts with 3 ch.

Make 40 ch, then start crocheting from the 2nd ch from the hook:

r1 - 39 sc

r2 - 39 sc

r3 - (1 inc dc) \*39 (78)

r4-8 (**5 rows**) - 78 dc

r9 - (5 dc, 1 inc dc) \*13 (91)

r10-14 (**5 rows**) - 91 dc

r15 - **in back loops only** - (1 inc dc) \*91 (182)

Crochet sc around the edges and top of the skirt, work 3 sc in 1 st in the corners.

**Make buttonholes** on one side of the skirt. Try on buttonholes for your buttons.

**Sew on 3 buttons** on the other side.

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.



Mark the middle **8 sts** on the front of the skirt, and **sew on 2 buttons**.

Make **straps**.

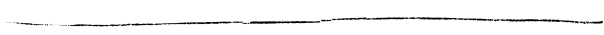
Put the skirt on the doll. Make the chain the length you want for the strap and buttonhole. Try on the buttonhole for your button.

Then, skip a few stitches of the buttonhole and crochet sc along the chain.

For example, I got it like this:

Make 30 ch, then skip 9 stitches from the hook and make 20 sc along the chain, 1 sl st.

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.



## SHOES

(make 2, crochet with *emerald* yarn)

When crocheting, make sure that the decreases are exactly in front of the shoes, and the hdc is exactly above the heel. Work some shift stitches if needed.

Make 8 ch, then start crocheting from the second ch from the hook:

r1 - 1 inc, 5 sc, 4 sc in 1 st, 5 sc, 1 inc (18)

r2 - 2 inc, 5 sc, 4 inc, 5 sc, 2 inc (26)

r3 - 26 sc (in back loops only)

r4 - 26 sc

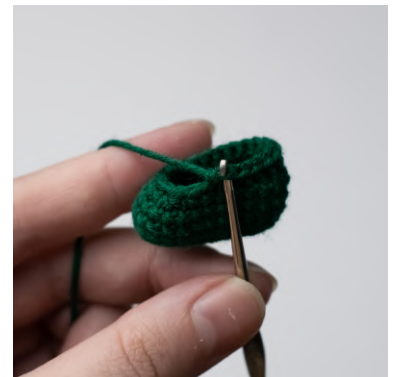
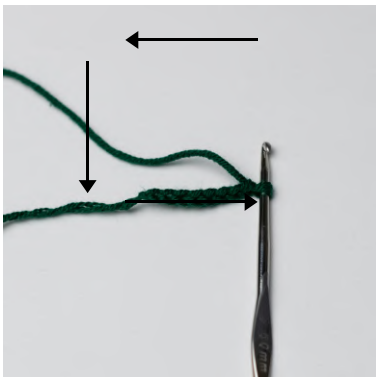
r5 - 24 sc, 2 hdc (26)

r6 - 3 hdc, 5 sc, 5 dec, 8 sc (21)

r7 - 7 sc, ch 6 (skip 7 st, crochet from 8th st), 7 sc (20)

r8 - 3 sc, 1 sl st (**crochet a round not to the end**)

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the ends using a needle.



## HAT

(crochet with **dark beige** yarn)

- r1 - 6 sc into the MR
- r2 - 6 inc (12)
- r3 - (1 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (18)
- r4 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (24)
- r5 - (3 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (30)
- r6 - (4 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (36)
- r7 - (5 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (42)
- r8 - (6 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (48)
- r9 - (7 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (54)
- r10 - 54 sc (in back loops only)
- r11-14 (**4 rounds**) - 54 sc
- r15 - in front loops only - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*18 (72)
- r16 - (11 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (78)
- r17 - 6 sc, 1 inc, (12 sc, 1 inc) \*5, 6 sc (84)
- r18 - (13 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (90)
- r19 - 7 sc, 1 inc, (14 sc, 1 inc) \*5, 7 sc (96)
- r20 - (15 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (102)
- r21 - 8 sc, 1 inc, (16 sc, 1 inc) \*5, 8 sc (108)
- r22 - (17 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (114)
- r23 - 114 sc
- r24 - 114 sl st



Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.



## BAG

(crochet with **dark beige** yarn)

Make 11 ch, then start crocheting from the second ch from the hook:

r1 - 1 inc, 8 sc, 4 sc in 1 st, 8 sc, 1 inc (24)

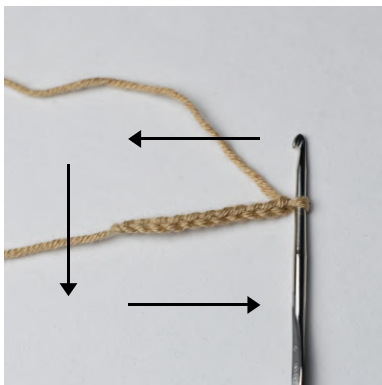
r2 - 2 inc, 8 sc, 4 inc, 8 sc, 2 inc (32)

r3 - (1 sc, 1 inc) \*2, 8 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) \*4, 8 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (40)

r4-15 (**12 rounds**) - 40 sc

r16 - 7 sl st, ch 35 (skip 6 st, crochet from 7th st), 14 sl st, ch 35 (skip 6 st, crochet from 7th st), 7 sl st **-make sure that the handles of the bag are symmetrical.**

Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.



## APPLE

(crochet with **yellow or red** yarn)

r1 - 7 sc into the MR

r2 - 7 inc (14)

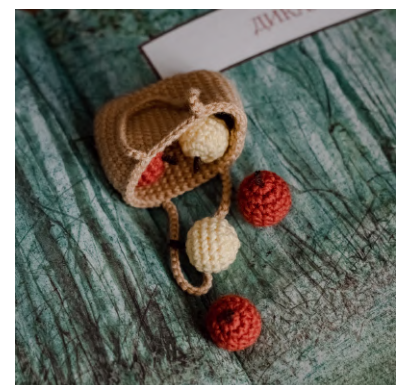
r3-6 (**4 rounds**) - 14 sc

r7 - 7 dec (7)

Cut the thread and fasten off . Close the remaining hole using a needle. Insert the needle under front loops only and pull the opening closed. Then insert it into the center and weave in end.



Squeeze an apple.





## GOOSE

(crochet with **white** yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR  
r2 - 6 inc (12)  
r3 - (1 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (18)  
r4 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (24)  
r5 - 24 sc  
r6 - (3 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (30)  
r7 - 30 sc  
r8 - (4 sc, 1 inc) \*6 (36)  
r9-11 (**3 rounds**) - 36 sc



**Crochet the neck.** Skip 22 st, crochet from 23th st:

r12-13 (**2 rounds**) - 14 sc  
r14 - (1 dec, 5 sc) \*2 (12)  
r15 - 5 sc, 1 dec, 5 sc (11)  
r16 - 5 sc, 1 dec, 4 sc (10)  
r17-18 (**2 rounds**) - 10 sc  
r19 - 1 inc, 3 sc, 3 inc, 3 sc (14)  
r20 - 1 sc, 1 inc, 3 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) \*3, 3 sc (18)  
r21-23 (**3 rounds**) - 18 sc  
r24 - 2 sc, 1 dec, 3 sc, (1 sc, 1 dec) \*3, 2 sc (14)  
r25 - 7 dec (7)

**Stuff the neck and head** with a wooden stick.

Cut the thread and fasten off . Close the remaining hole using a needle. Insert the needle under front loops only and pull the opening closed. Then insert it into the center and weave in end.





**Crochet the tail.** Skip 7 st from the neck, start crochet from the 8th st. Attach the white thread, leaving a long end at the beginning to sew up the back.

r1 - 8 sc

r2 - (2 sc, 1 dec) \*2 (6)

Cut the thread and fasten off . Close the remaining hole using a needle. Insert the needle under front loops only and pull the opening closed. Then insert it into the center and weave in end.

**Stuff the body and sew up the hole**, inserting the needle under the front loops. Cut and fasten off the thread. Hide the thread ends using a needle.



## BEAK

(crochet with **orange** yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

r2 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (8)

r3 - 3 sc, 2 inc, 3 sc (10)

r4 - 4 sc, 2 inc, 4 sc (12)

Crochet 1 sl st. Cut the thread and fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

**Squeeze the beak** with your hands and shape it as shown in the picture.



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## WINGS

(make 2, crochet with **white** yarn)

Don't stuff.

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

r2 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (8)

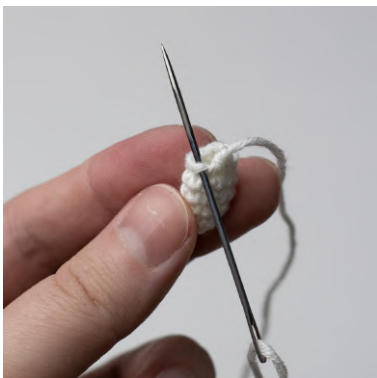
r3 - (3 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (10)

r4 - 10 sc

r5 - (3 sc, 1 dec) \*2 (8)

Cut the thread, leaving a long tail for sewing. Close the remaining hole using a needle. Insert the needle under front loops only and pull the opening closed.

Then insert the needle into the center, and bring it out to the side of the wing.



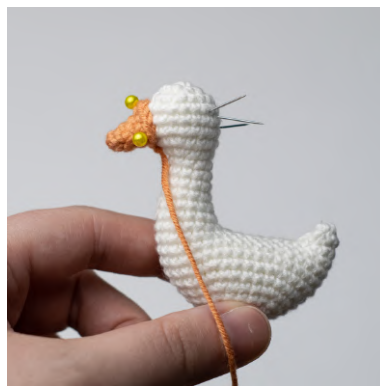
**Sew the beak** between the 19th and 24th rounds, after securing with pins.

**Don't stuff** the beak.

**Make a beak shaping.**

Insert a needle with an **orange** thread at the back of the head, and bring it out at the top of the beak into the first nostril (between the 3rd and 4th rounds). Move to the side by 1 sc, insert the needle at this point, and bring it out into the second nostril, skipping a couple of sc from the first. Move to the side by 1 sc, insert the needle at this point, and bring it out to the lower part of the beak between the 3rd and 4th rounds. Move to the side by 1 sc, insert the needle at this point, and bring it out at the back of the head to the first point.

Tie thread's ends with 2 knots and weave in inside of the head.



**Embroider the eyes** with thin black thread between the 21st and 22nd rounds.



## UPPER PART OF LEGS

(make 2, crochet with **white** yarn)

r1 - 6 sc into the MR

r2 - (2 sc, 1 inc) \*2 (8)

Crochet 1 sl st. Cut the thread and fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

**Sew the details** between the 1st and 4th rounds, shifting a little forward so that the goose can sit.

Stuff the details a little or don't stuff.





***Sew on the wings*** so that the top of the wing is between rounds 10 and 11.

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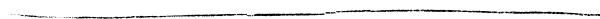
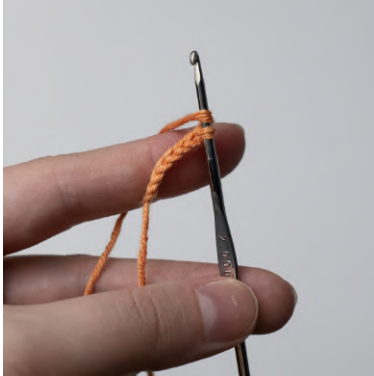
## **LEGS**

(make 2, crochet with **orange** yarn)

Make 7 ch (**leaving a long end at the beginning**) then start crocheting from the 4th ch from the hook:

r1 - (1 dc, ch 3, 1 sl st) - **in 1 st**, 3 sl st **along the chain**

***Sew on the legs*** as shown in the picture. Pull the ends of the thread to one point, tie with 2 knots and hide the ends using a needle.
