



## Eyes

Whit the yarn of Bridal white color #105

R1: 6 mr (6)

R2: 6 inc (12)

sl st into the first st.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for attaching to the Pumpkin.

Insert the safety eyes. You can choose any positioning for the safety eyes. Depending on th placement, the pumpkin's gaze may vary. I placed the safety eyes on the inner edge of the white part first: between the 2nd and 3rd round





# Pumpkin

Whit the yarn of tangerine color #281

R1: 6 mr (6)

R2: 6 inc (12)

R3: (sc, inc)\*6 (18)

R4: (2sc, inc)\*6 (24)

R5: (3sc, inc)\*6 (30)

R6: (4sc, inc)\*6 (36)

R7: (5sc, inc)\*6 (42)

R8-12: 42sc [3rnd] (42)

R13: (5sc, dec)\*6 (36) at row 9, insert the safety eyes, leaving a distante of 4 stiches between them. Once they are secured, you can begin sewing them

R10: (4sc, dec)\*6 (30)

R11: (3sc, dec)\*6 (24)

R12: (sc, dec, sc)\*6 (18)

Stuff with fiberfill and continue adding



stuffing as the work progresses

R13: (sc, dec)\*6 (6)

R14: 6 dec

Finish your work with a sl st.











Secure, leaving a long tail—24 inches or maybe even more depending on the weight of the yarn you used. Insert the needle in the center and pass it from one side of the ball to the other, from bottom to top, then pull the thread to form the first segment of the pumpkin. Repeat the same process on the opposite side, then continue by dividing the ball into 4 equal parts, pulling the thread each time to form the segments







Embroider the mouth and create rosy cheeks using wax crayons

### Stem

Whit the yarn of black coffee color #162

R1: 5mr

R2: Idec, 4sc (4)

R3/5: 4sc

Fasten off leaving a long tail for attaching to the Pumpkin.













### Leaf

With the lime yarn color 512, work 10 chains.

R1: Starting from the second chain, work 8sc, and in the last chain, work 3 sc. On the other side, work 6 sc and turn your work.

Now, work all stitches in the back loop only (BLO).


R2: Chain 1, work 7 sc, 3 sc in the same stitch, 6 sc, and turn your work.

R4: Chain 1, work 7 sc, 3 sc in the same stitch, 7 sc, and turn your work.

R5: Chain 1, work 8 sc, 3 sc in the same stitch, 6 sc, and turn your work.

R6: Chain 1, work 7 sc, 3 sc in the same stitch, 7 sc, and fasten off.









With the same yarn, create a chain of 140 stitches.

Leave a long tail and cut the yarn. We will use it to sew it to the leaf.

Fold the long chain in half and insert the needle in the center, making a small knot. Now you can sew it to the base of the pumpkin.
